THE HOMILY FROM THE MASS OF CHRISTIAN BURIAL **OF DEACON MARK CZERWINSKI**

he Parish of St. Paul & St. Ann grieves — along with his beloved family: wife Jennifer, daughters Mary and Elizabeth, mom Irene, sister and brother, Laura and Kevin; we grieve the loss of Deacon Mark Czerwinski.

He served the needs of his beloved family with gentle love, care, and fatherly guidance; and he served the needs of the family of this parish with commitment, dedication, and the same gentle, loving care. The essential character of the Roman Catholic deacon is precisely service Diakonia — and Deacon Mark lived his dual-vocation as husband/father and deacon through ministerial service: offering this community and the community of the Church both a beautiful family and a beautiful ministry in terms of education, sacramentality, and pasto-

I remember when Mark first came to me back in 2003 or so with the idea of entering the

deacon formation program for the Archdiocese of New York. His intentions were pure in that he felt the need to discern what he believed to be a call from God to offer compassion and accompaniment to the People of God who are the Church — particularly here in his beloved Rockland County.

Discerning such a vocation would demand of him an openness to Spirit-filled enrichment and learning — such as was presented to him in the very demanding academic and spiritual formation program offered at St. Joseph's Seminary in Yonkers. Church history, sacramental, dogmatic and pastoral theology were the areas he delved into with zeal — I know, because he often allowed me to read and comment on the papers he would frequently be submitting to his professors.

Grammar and style of expression were hardly areas of valid critique, since Mark was also a professional sports writer for the New Jersey Paterson News and the Bergen Record newspapers. Mark was like Ray Romano — the sportswriter character on the hit TV show "Everybody Loves Raymond," but only inasmuch as "Everybody Loved Mark." And, of course, to show his closeness to God's "little ones," Mark was a faithful fellow-Mets fan! Whether he was writing about local high school sports or fishing the rivers of northern New Jersey, he graced both the topics and the athletes of his columns with all due respect and dignity.

I remember, too, asking him to assume the leadership of the RCIA program here at St. Paul's — a position which he embraced with the same fatherly care and zeal which characterized the most important aspects of his life: family and service.

Deacon Mark would then embrace the debility and fragility of the human condition over these recent years with dignity and faith; and although he has gone ahead of us much too soon, he has indeed gone "to prepare a place" —

like Jesus did — for his family in the natural order, and for his family in the spiritual order right here at St. Paul & St. Ann Parish.

And so it is good and right for us to be here this morning in this place as a family — celebrating and remembering the life that God gave to Mark Czerwinski. Painful though this loss indeed is, it is the time to share memories and to encourage one another through our shared faith in the resurrection which Deacon Mark lived and taught and preached so well.

And yes, it is also a time for us to say goodbye to Deacon Mark. Though saying goodbye is so very difficult, it is also so very important: he was your beloved son, husband and father, brother and uncle, friend and deacon. He was — and remains in spirit — one of the most influential figures in your life, dear family, and in the life of this faith community.

So when it comes right down to it, this mass is just as important for us who go on as it is for the one who has died.

It is said that Jesus never presided over a funeral. And that's because when Jesus came into the presence of death, the dead came back to life! Deacon Mark was determined to live his life for us in the presence of Jesus. And death has no power over him, who was so dedicated to the Lord of Life. He has gone ahead of us, where for him, life has changed, not ended! May he now find the deepest of joy in the presence of God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Thank you Deacon Mark Czerwinski! Thank you for your life of loving service!

DEACON MARK'S FUNERAL MASS HELD AT ST. PAUL'S CHURCH

On Thursday, Oct. 15, our Christian community gathered at St. Paul's Church for the funeral of our beloved Deacon Mark Czerwinski. Together his family, friends, fellow parishioners, priests and fellow deacons assembled in prayer as the Church, in the celebration of the Mass of Christian Burial, surrendered him into Our Father's loving hands.

The principal celebrant of the mass was His Excellency, The Most Reverend Edmund J. Whalen, D.D., Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of New York. Co-celebrants were: Rev. Msgr. Emmet Nevin, Dean of Rockland County, pastor of St. Aedan's, and former pastor of St. Paul's; Rev. Arthur Mastrolia, pastor of St. Clare's in Staten Island and former St. Paul's pastor, who was the homilist; and the Oratorian Fathers, Rev. Vladimir Chripko, pastor of St. Paul & St. Ann's, Assistant pastor, Rev. Roman Palecko, Revs. Raju and Joseph Narisetty, and

Rev. Peter Bujdos.

Among the deacons who took part in the mass were Deacon Mark's fellow deacons who served with him at St. Paul & St. Anns: Deacon Dominic Buonocore, Deacon Luke Conroy, and Deacon Jerry Fenton. Also present were Deacon Frank Orlando, Director of the Diaconate Formation Program at St. Joseph's Seminary, Deacon Rob Pang from St. John's in Piermont, and Deacons John Kelley and George Albin from St. Gregory Barbarigo in Garnerville.

The readings at mass were proclaimed by Deacon Mark's daughters, Elizabeth and Mary. His sister, Laura Biktjorn, delivered the eulogy. His mother, Irene, was also present with Deacon Mark's wife, Jennifer.


Rob Campodonico, a St. Paul & St. Ann's parishioner, assisted as altar server.

After the final blessing, the burial took place at Gethsemane Cemetery at Rockland Lake, where Deacon Mark was laid to rest next to his father, Thomas Czerwinski. Fr. Vladimir,

Fr. Roman, and Deacon Jerry presided at the interment.



IN DEACON MARK'S OWN WORDS

Deacon Mark was a well-respected professional writer, and his carefully crafted homilies and essays were a gift to our parish. Here are two excerpts. I first met Deacon Mark in September 2015.

I recently had my third child, who was then 6 months old, and I was looking to have him baptized.

At that time, I really didn't belong to any church in particular for many personal reasons. Nonetheless, I so wanted my child to be baptized because it was important to me.

In addition, I hadn't been attached to any religious practices or institutions. Not a Catholic, nor a Christian, I was of no denomination — until I met the wonderful deacon Mark. That is where the beginning of many blessings unfolded.

Deacon Mark was very inviting, warm hearted and compassionate, nonjudgmental in any of my past qualms. In fact, he was very understanding, and even more welcoming.

We talked about my signing up for the RCIA class, which Deacon Mark taught along with other fellow dedicated members of St. Paul's.

I decided soon after to follow my true heart and join the class. I couldn't have been any more fulfilled by choosing to do so.

It created an even more burning light inside.

Meeting every Tuesday was something I looked forward to. There were many Tuesdays I could not have my husband watch our baby because of other obligations, but Deacon Mark encouraged me to bring my son. It was a blessing to have him there too joining us, even

if it meant him crawling under the tables or on top.

I remember when the classes reached the end and it was time to make my sacraments, which included Deacon marrying my husband and me in the Church. I remember my life becoming more in tune. So much changed for the better, and I have Deacon Mark to thank.

I remember saying thank you to Deacon Mark for the class and all he had done for me, but also for all he would continue to do for all the upcoming candidates.

I believe that Deacon Mark was and still is a beautiful soul on this earth. May his life and memory continue to be a blessing to all those he encountered.



Are You "SURE" You're a Registered Parishioner?

Many times we meet people at church who attend mass, take part in events, or perhaps even have received their sacraments here. We're so very glad you're with us and part of our community. But that alone does not make you a parishioner. To be a member of the parish you have to REGISTER. Registering is very easy. You can register online at *spasaparish.org* or at the parish office. It only takes a few minutes.

Everyone over the age of 18 is encouraged to register. Even if you're an adult who received all your sacraments here as a child and still attend mass here, you need to register.

Why register? First and foremost, it's very important to register so we can serve your needs when, for example, you need a sponsor certification letter for Baptism or Confirmation. Also, to receive an acknowledgment of your donations for your income tax filing, you need to be registered so we have an official record of your giving over the year.

So, please join us officially and register with the parish so we can meet all your needs now and in the future!

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SPONSOR CERTIFICATION LETTER

In order to receive a sponsor certification letter from the Parish of St. Paul & St. Ann, you must be an <u>ACTIVE</u>, <u>REGISTERED PARISHIONER</u> for 6 MONTHS. IF YOU ARE NOT OFFICIALLY REGISTERED AND DO NOT ATTEND MASS, YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE A LETTER.

The role of a sponsor is to lead a Christian life in a manner that faithfully fulfills the obligations of the Catholic faith. A sponsor must be living the Catholic faith and be able to be part of the sponsored person's life after the Baptism, who can guide him/her spiritually.

A sponsor must also:

- Be at least 16 years of age
- Have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation
- If married, must be married according to the laws of the Catholic Church



A Civil War Substitute

During the Civil War it was permitted for one man to take the place of another in the army.

It so happened that a farmer by the name of Blake was drafted. He was grief-stricken, not because he was a coward, but because he had a wife and children to take care of.

The day before he was to report at camp, a young neighbor by the name of Charles Durham came to Blake's farm.

"Mr. Blake," he said, "I will go instead of you."

The offer was accepted. The entire village turned out to bid farewell to the generous young man.

In the very first battle in which he engaged, young Durham was shot and killed.

When Blake read the name of his young friend in the list of the dead, he saddled his horse, rushed to the battlefield, found Durham's body, and brought it back to the little churchyard in the village.

He found a large stone upon a hill and he carved an inscription. It wasn't beautiful, but it was sincere.

Blake placed it above the fresh sod-covered mound in the churchyard. It was not an elaborate inscription but it said much. It simply read "C.D. He died for me."

Above the cross of Christ and over our grave each one of us must carve the words: He died for me.

Christ took upon himself the suffering and evil unleashed by Adam's sin and perpetuated by our sins. His perfect, loving obedience up to death on the cross reversed Adam's rebellion and freed us from the power of the devil.

Jesus has lit in our hearts the flame of certain hope that will lead us to eternal life.
