PENTECOST

A FRESH PERSPECTIVE ON THE SUNDAY READINGS **HIS WORD TODAY** by Rev. William J. Reilly

Pentecost Sunday May 20, 2018

"Jesus stood up and exclaimed; 'Let anyone who thirsts come to Me and drink. As Scripture says: Rivers of living water will flow from within him who believes in Me.' He said this in reference to the Spirit that those who came to believe were to receive."

The great event in Jerusalem, marked by wind, noise and fire, was a moment of fulfillment and at the same time of beginning for the life of the church. The signs and wonders of Pentecost are so familiar surrounding the radical change which took place in the upper room.

Jesus speaks to us today, leading me to ask myself: Do I thirst for the Lord? When we are thirsty we long for a drink, for refreshment, to be renewed. The reading from John, who always speaks about belief and believers, reminds me to pray 'Come Holy Spirit' in the events of my daily life. I am thirsty for the Lord, yes or no. The Spirit is part of my family life, of my home and work. The Spirit leads and guides me, but only if I ask and give in.

Speaking of thirst, remember the words on the lips of Jesus at Calvary, 'I thirst'. He thirsts still for you and for your Spirit filled life.

MAY 20, 2018 PENTECOST SUNDAY

First Reading:

Acts 2:1-11

During the Feast of Pentecost, tongues of fire came to rest on the heads of the disciples and they were filled with the Holy Spirit. Each disciple began speaking in a different language, and were understood by people from many different regions who were amazed at what thev had witnessed.

Second Reading:

1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13 Paul explains that we are all members of one body. We have all been baptized in one Spirit and although numerous, we are one through Christ.

Gospel: John 20:19-23
John describes Jesus' first visit to the disciples after his resurrection.
He gave them the Holy Spirit and the power to forgive other people or hold them responsible for their actions.



KUZHITHURAI A Vibrant Missionary Diocese of India!

Our guest homilist this weekend is Rev. Paul Leon Varuel who is the Mission Coordinator for the Diocese of Kuzhithurai in India. Fr. Paul Varuvel, originally from Kottar, was Vicar General there and is currently teaching at Christ the King Seminary in the diocese of Buffalo, NY.

The diocese of KUZHITHURAI is found in the southernmost point of India, comprising more than half of the district of Kanyakumari, in the State of Tamil Nadu. According to a persistent oral tradition, Christianity

reached the southern part of India through the missionary efforts of St. Thomas the Apostle. Later, St. Francis Xavier, the great Jesuit missionary, evangelized parts of this area in the 16th century (1542-1549). Kuzhithurai was erected as a separate diocese in 2014. Until then it was a part of the diocese of Kottar, erected in 1930.

Though small in territory, the present diocese of Kuzhithurai is densely populated. There are about 850,000 people in an area of just 350 sq. miles. Catholics constitute about 30% of the population. Farming and masonry are the main traditional occupations of the Catholic community here.

Our Needs and Concerns

The major concerns of the diocese of Kuzhithurai are: Evangelization, Fostering Vocations to the Priesthood and the Religious Life, Education, and Socio-economic Development. We need your help and prayers for the success of the mission work of the diocese of Kottar: These are our pressing needs:

- Evangelization deepening the faith and spreading the Gospel
- Training catechists and other leaders among the Laity for Gospel work
- Fostering vocations to the priesthood and the religious life
- Improving the socio-economic condition of the poor
- Promoting dialogue and understanding among Christians, Hindus and Muslims
- Establishing and strengthening small Faith Sharing Communities

Program of Assistance for Persons with Handicaps

Due to the lack of proper medical insurance, many persons with physical or mental handicaps do not receive adequate care. The diocese of Kuzhithurai has opened its doors to receive persons with disabilities, especially children, and care for them. Adequate funding, however, is not easily available. We need your support to maintain and expand this program which provides medical, social, economic, psychological and spiritual assistance to several dozens of persons with handicaps.

On December 2, 2012, the Servant of God Devasahayam Pillai (1712-1752), a native of Kuzhithurai diocese and a Catholic convert from Hinduism, was declared a Martyr on the occasion of his Beatification at St. Xavier's Cathedral, Kottar. The process of canonization is under way.


