

June 9, 2019 - Pentecost Sunday

First Reading: Acts 2:1-11

The disciples were celebrating Pentecost together when "tongues of fire appeared which parted, then came to rest on each of them." The disciples were filled with the Holy Spirit and began speaking in foreign tongues. Visitors from many different countries were amazed that each guest could hear his or her native language being spoken as the disciples proclaimed God's glory.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13

Each person has received different manifestations of the same spirit to contribute to the common good of all. All members of the church have been baptized into one body because of our belief in the Holy Spirit, who was sent to us by God.

Gospel: John 20:19-23

Jesus appeared to the disciples even though they had locked the doors in fear. Jesus then showed the disciples his hands and his side; and they rejoiced at his presence. He breathed on them saying "Receive the Holy Spirit." He then gave the disciples the power to forgive others or hold them accountable for their sins.

"In the same way, the Spirit too comes to the aid of our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes with inexpressible groaning. And the one who searches hearts knows what is the intention of the Spirit, because he intercedes for the holy ones according to God's will."

The promised Spirit has come and gives life to the church. Pentecost was not just an event or experience, but the beginning of a movement which continues to this very moment. The visible of wind, fire and noise may have subsided but the event becomes our experience.

The movement which began in the upper room, spread to the streets of Jerusalem, and moves us today. Our church, enlivened and motivated by the same Spirit summons us to go out and transform a world seemingly distant from the gospel and its values. The Spirit, living in us, yearns to touch the lives of others. Because of the Holy Spirit we too have been changed, let the Spirit move you, or as Paul says 'don't stifle the Spirit.' The email that you receive from Parish Giving will give you special access to your private family portal as well as a unique password to register your child(ren). Payment will also be done at the time of registration.



TODAY'S SECOND COLLECTION FOR FOOD PANTRY

The Parish Council has unanimously approved an action recommended by the Peace Justice & Social Action Committee to address a local need: that there are many members of our community where hunger remains a problem.





that our Parish can take - with today's second collection. The Hastings Food Pantry is a walk-in Pantry that provides a bag of groceries a week to those in need, in our community. They also hand out gift cards that can be used at Food Town, Dobbs Ferry's Stop and Shop, and other participating food stores.

What we are going to do is have a second collection a few times a year. The first time will be this weekend.

With the funds that are collected, the Committee will purchase the gift cards and give them to the Director of the Youth Advocate Office at the Community Center in Hastings, where she oversees the food pantry. She has agreed to distribute these cards to those in need, including members of the <u>OLPH</u> and St. Matthew's communities, <u>regardless of residency</u>. Persons in Ardsley can be directed to the Hastings site.

This is a concrete action by our parishes to help alleviate hunger for some of the members of our community. Please give what you can afford. No amount is too small. Thank you.

Jesus appeared to the disciples in the locked room and said to them, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent Me, so I send you." He was preparing them for their missionary work.






Birthdays come with gifts!

The 7 Gifts of the Holy Spirit were promised by Christ and are made known to us by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation.









Follow these directions to turn the cross into a gift box.

Color then cut on dotted lines - fold on light, solid lines into gift box, tape deges together, then the remaining edges.







Jesus died on the cross out of love for us. This same love gives us the Gifts of the Spirit to help us on our journey as disciples of Christ.



Color the bow red; **RED** is the color of Pentecost, the vestments of the priest and the color people wear to signify the **LOVE** and **FIRE** of the **SPIRIT**.
