Dear Parishioners, Neighbors and Friends,

As our church year of 2020 is ending, our new year of 2021 begins with the first Sunday of Advent, November 29th. The Mass readings for the end of the church year challenge us to think of the final reckoning and whether we will be with the "Lovers" or "Haters" at the end time.

This past year has not been an easy one. Daily we hear of the continuing growth of the devastating Covid-19 virus. The campaign and election brought about great tensions, anger, anxieties, fights, broken friendships and broken families that have not yet healed. It sure feels like the forces of darkness are winning and unleashing great chaos upon us.

Those feelings are the same that people felt before Christ came into the world. The world seemed on the verge of collapse without much hope for a better future. It was into that world that the Christ child was born to bring hope to the world that the power of love would triumph over the forces of hate.

It is with that spirit of hope and love that we move towards the feast of the Incarnation, celebrating God's becoming one of us as an innocent vulnerable infant in Bethlehem. That spirit can enable us to be grateful for all the blessings that we do have this year at Christmas.

Like all things "covid", we will need to make sacrifices this year. This is especially true of our Christmas Masses. We cannot afford to have anyone afflicted with the virus as a result of coming to Christmas Mass. We will make sure to enforce all the guidelines to have a safe space for our parish family, including children and elderly.

As a very special exception, Rome has allowed that <u>for this year</u> <u>only</u> we will be permitted to celebrate Mass on Christmas Eve as early as 2:00 p.m. Included with this letter is a schedule of the Masses we intend to have for Christmas. In order to have a handle on the number of people who can fit into the churches in accordance with the guidelines, we must limit the number of people to those with tickets. We expect to have a fair process of registration for tickets so that all parishioners who want to attend Mass may do so. In addition to the schedule you will find a registration form included. This form may be submitted by email, Flocknote, or dropped off in the <u>rectory</u> mailbox, or in the Sunday collection basket. Because of Christmas mails we request that you do not send registrations through the US Mail. Once the whole registration process is complete, there will be instructions on when the tickets may be picked up at the rectory. PLEASE REMEMBER THAT THE REASON FOR TICKETS IS FOR SAFETY AND FAIRNESS.

For the same reasons, regretfully, we will not have a Christmas Pageant nor choir this year. If it can be worked out there might be a parish Christmas sing-a-long via zoom.

IF YOU HAVE BEEN EXPOSED TO OR SHOW SYMPTOMS OF COVID, **PLEASE**, DO NOT COME TO CHURCH. THERE WILL BE A STREAMED LIVE MASS FOR CHRISTMAS. THERE IS NO OBLIGATION TO ATTEND MASS ON CHRISTMAS THIS YEAR.

Finally, each year we rely heavily on your generosity in the Christmas Flower, and Christmas collections for support. I know some of you are facing financial hardship due to the virus. God and I understand. For those of you who are able, please be your generous selves in giving your donation to the parish this Christmas.

As a parish family, let us give thanks to God for our blessings, and do what we can for those in need, remember those who have died, be kind to all, patient in the seasonal rush, understanding of those who annoy us, maintain a sense of humor and joy and pray for the whole human race. If we do then we will truly celebrate the joyous feast of God's love for all.

May God Bless you for all the good that you do and will do, and on behalf of Fr. Thomas, Fr. Gabriel, Fr. Nicholas and myself we wish you a very Sacred and Happy Christmas.

November 29, 2020 - First Sunday of Advent

First Reading: Isaiah 63:16b-17, 19b, 64:2-7

In this straightforward psalm, the people acknowledge their sinful ways, yet plead that their Creator might reveal himself to them. They ask God to remember, not their sins, but that "We are all the work of your hands."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

Paul explains to the Corinthians that they are specially favored by God who has sent his only Son to them. He reminds us all that it was through God's grace that we have been called to kinship with Christ.

Gospel: Mark 13:33-37

Just as a servant watching over the master's house does not know when he will return, we do not know the hour of the Second Coming. Mark reminds us of the warning from Jesus to always be on guard, for we know not the day nor

the hour.

First Sunday of Advent November 29, 2020

"You, Lord, are our father, our redeemer you are named forever. Why do you let us wander from your ways and harden our hearts so that we fear you not? Return for the sake of your servants, the tribes of your heritage. Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down... would that you might meet us as doing right, that we were mindful of you in our ways!"

A new and special time of prayer has begun. Silently and sneakily, an enemy has redirected our lives since early March. Our lives have been altered and we were summoned to consider what is of real importance our family, our health, including our spiritual life. This is our advent infected by the virus.

As we begin the period of hope and expectation, may we look to the Word of God, find a time for prayer and reflection each day. We ask, why is this advent to be different? Are You "SURE" You're a Registered Parishioner?

Many times we meet people at church who attend mass, take part in events, or perhaps even have received their sacraments here. We're so very glad you're with us and part of our community. But that alone does not make you a parishioner. To be a member of the parish you have to REGISTER. Registering is very easy. You can fill out a registration form online at *www.stmolph.com* or at the parish office. It only takes a few minutes.

Everyone over the age of 18 is encouraged to register. Even if you're an adult who received all your sacraments here as a child and still attend mass here, you need to register.

Why register? First and foremost, it's very important to register so we can serve your needs when, for example, you need a sponsor letter for Baptism or Confirmation. Also, to receive an acknowledgement of your donations for your income tax filing, you need to be registered so we have an official record of your giving over the year.

So, please join us officially and register with the parish so we can meet all your needs now and in the future!

INSTRUCTIONS FOR SPONSOR CERTIFICATION LETTER

In order to receive a sponsor certification letter from the Parish of St. Matthew & Our Lady of Perpetual Help, you must be an <u>ACTIVE, REGISTERED</u> <u>PARISHIONER</u>. If you are not officially registered and do not attend mass, you will not receive a letter.

The role of a sponsor is to lead a Christian life in a manner that faithfully fulfills the obligations of the Catholic faith. A sponsor must be living the Catholic faith and be able to be part of the sponsored person's life after the Baptism/ Confirmation, who can guide him/her spiritually.

A sponsor must also:

- Be at least 16 years of age
- Have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation
- If married, must be married according to the laws of the Catholic Church
- Attend Mass weekly and on Holy Days of Obligation

• The person needing the Sponsor letter must contact and meet with the parish priest themselves.
