

January 9, 2022 - The Baptism of the Lord

Reading I: Isaiah 60: 1-6

A wonderful introduction leads into a description of a procession of all the world coming to Mt. Zion to rebuild Jerusalem.

Reading II: Ephesians 3: 2-3a, 5-6

Paul interprets the revealed mystery of Christ, namely that Gentiles are full participants in the Church.

The Gospel: Matthew 2: 1-12

The wise men represent the Gentile world in all diversity worship racial coming to Christ. "The East" in this case could be Persia. Syria, or Arabia. They acknowledge Jesus as a royal Messiah.



The December Parish Council meeting was held on December 16 at the St. Matthew Church Parish Council rectory. The council reviewed the draft financial report of the






