

A wish for Yahweh to come down from heaven and help cleanse the nation of its guilt and sins.


#### Reading II: 1 Corinthians 1: 3-9



# "Christ-Lock: Identity Theft No More!"

A parish mission directed by Fr. Bill Garrott, O.P.

Father Bill Garrott, O.P., nationally known for his inspirational and uplifting presentations, will offer and Advent Mission on December 17, 18 & 19th at St. Matthew Church.

A member of the Dominican Order, Father Garrott is known for both his preaching ability and musical talent. He has led over 200 parish missions throughout the United States and Canada, using word and song to help people experience God's unconditional love and bring them into a personal encounter with Jesus.

"You might call my ministry a ministry of encouragement," Father Garrott has said. "I'm preaching the theological version of hope. God has a plan, and God provides always."



"The Christ-Lock mission is a unique, grace-filled evangelical moment in the life of a parish which aims to help parishioners enter more deeply into the love of the Holy Trinity and experience God's merciful touch through the sacraments.

#### Sunday Evening's Talk: "Where is your faith?"

Fr. Bill's preaching focuses on what Faith is and is not in light of current challenges. The evening concludes with an invitation to venerate a 1st class relic of St. John Paul II – a piece of the blood-soaked white sash he wore on the day he was shot in St. Peter's Square.

#### Monday Evening's Talk: "Are you right to be angry?"

Fr. Bill's preaching focuses on the emotion, the virtue and the sin of anger in light of the polarized culture we live in. The evening concludes with an invitation for those in need of healing to adore our Eucharistic Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

#### Tuesday Evening's Talk: "Take away the stone!"

Fr. Bill's preaching focuses on the power of the Risen Lord to heal us and make us participants in God's great rescue mission of mercy. The evening concludes with a solemn blessing and an invitation to receive a special blessing with the Oil of St. Joseph from the Oratory of St. Joseph in Montreal.



Each night, the Mission will begin at 7pm in the Church with the Rosary beginning at 6:30pm. Fr. Garrott will also hear confessions each evening following the talk.




Classes resume this week: Wednesday, December 6th and Sunday, December 10th.



The Parish Council met on November 16, 2023. Elizabeth Heilakka and Paul Perillo were introduced as the newest members of the Parish Council. Stephanie Bonney, the parish's new coordinator of religious education, provided an overview of the program to the council and how the year is progressing. Fr. Crawford reported that the CYO basketball season opened earlier this month

with a Mass at St. Matthew and a pep rally at the Hastings High School gym. Fr. Crawford informed the council that Fr. George Lodi, a recently retired priest of the Archdiocese, will be moving into the rectory at St. Matthew after Thanksgiving and assisting with the saying of Mass, communion calls, confessions, etc. Fr. Crawford also shared that the parish's goal for the 2024 Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal has increased slightly. The parish was able to exceed its goal in 2023, so hopefully we can do so again next year. About 80 Stocking Stuffer raffle tickets have been sold; the parish needs to sell 100 raffle tickets to break even. Everyone is encouraged to purchase a ticket or ask friends and family members to purchase a ticket. Fr. Crawford met with parishioners interested in the Altar Society on November 7; a core group of volunteers is currently being formed. The coffee hour at St. Matthew is going well; it will be held on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of most months after the 8:30 a.m. Mass. The OLPH coffee hour is also going well and it is being held on the 2nd Sunday of the month after the 10 a.m. Mass. The next parish council meeting is scheduled for December 14th. Parishioners are welcome to contact Fr. Crawford or Bryan Healy with any questions or concerns to address.
