



May 11, 2025 - 4th Sunday of Easter

Reading I: Acts 13: 14, 43-52

Paul and Barnabas make the First of three missionary journeys. They preach the Word in Antioch, where many Gentiles became believers. However, the majority of Jews in the city did not accept the Faith.

Reading II: Revelation 7:9, 14b-17

The uncountable crowd in John's vision are the spiritual sons and daughters of Abraham promised him by God. These faithful wear white, signifying their emergence from trials and persecution. The Lamb leads them to heavenly joy.

The Gospel: John 10: 27-30. Jesus' protection equals that of the Father, who shields all believers from the threats of Satan the enemy of the Kingdom. Jesus declares that the Trinity of Persons is actually one God.



Staple your attendance envelope to the bulletin and drop it in the collection basket the following week.




On Friday, May 2nd, all families currently in the Religious Education Program received an email from Parish Giving to register their child(ren) for the 2025-2026 school year. This year, there is a registration form for Grades 1-6 and a separate form for Confirmation Grades 7-8. If you have children in both grade levels,

you *MUST* use both forms to register all your children. If you are new to the program, or registering a child for the first time, there is a link on the parish website to begin the registration process for *New Families*.

If you register before June 30th, you will receive a discount of \$100 off of tuition. Sacramental fees are not discounted.

10 Of the Very Best Quotes from Pope Francis

These powerful words from the late pontiff cover all areas of life and show Catholics how to live out their faith.

For Catholics around the world, the passing of Pope Francis marks the end of an era defined by compassion, humility, and hope. As we bid farewell to this beloved Holy Father at his funeral today, we also celebrate the profound wisdom he shared in words and deeds.

Throughout his life, Pope Francis had a remarkable gift for speaking to our everyday joys and struggles with warmth and faith, inspiring us to live



the Gospel in practical ways. He emphasized caring for the poor, the importance of family, mercy, justice, and walking humbly with God.

In tribute to his life of service, here are 10 of Pope Francis's most resonant quotes – drawn from his homilies, speeches, and writings – that continue to light the path for Catholics and all people of goodwill. Each quote speaks to a key aspect of Christian living, from faith and family to compassion and humility, reminding us of the enduring legacy of love he leaves behind.

"A little mercy makes the world less cold and more just."

From his very first Sunday Angelus message as pope, Pope Francis encouraged every person to practice mercy in daily life. He reminds us that even small acts of forgiveness and compassion can warm hearts and help build a more just society.

"No family drops down from heaven perfectly formed; families need constantly to grow and mature in the ability to love."

In his exhortation Amoris Laetitia (The Joy of Love), he taught that family life isn't always easy or perfect, but through patience, forgiveness, and love, our families become schools of growth in holiness. This gentle reminder reassures us that every family can, with God's grace, keep learning to love more fully.

"How I would like a Church which is poor and for the poor!"

Early in his pontificate, Francis expressed his dream for a Church that embraces simplicity and stands in solidarity with the needy. This vision, which he lived by example, calls all believers to care for the marginalized and to value spiritual riches over material wealth.

"The Lord never tires of forgiving. It is we who tire of asking for forgiveness."

A central theme of Francis' ministry was God's infinite mercy. He often reassured us that no matter how many times we fall, God is always ready to forgive us. The only thing that can hold us back is our own pride or discouragement. In this quote, he encourages us to humbly seek God's forgiveness without fear, trusting in the Lord's boundless mercy.

"We must restore hope to young people, help the old, be open to the future, spread love. Be poor among the poor. We need to include the excluded and preach peace."

Pope Francis shared this exhortation in an interview early in his papacy, summing up the Christian mission in society. It's a heartfelt call to action: to uplift the youth and the elderly, to live simply and lovingly, and to build communities grounded in hope and peace.

"Too often we participate in the globalization of indifference. May we strive instead to live global solidarity."

Francis warned against the modern tendency to become numb to the suffering of others. He urged us to replace indifference with compassion on a global scale. This quote challenges us to open our eyes and hearts to our neighbors' needs — whether next door or across the world — and to respond with a spirit of solidarity and care.

"Kindness is firm and persevering intention to always will the good of others, even the unfriendly."

In defining kindness, Pope Francis stressed that it's not a passive or weak attitude but a steadfast decision to seek the good of everyone. Even when faced with hostility, the Christian is called to respond with patient love. This insight reflects his belief that loving one another is the strongest force for transformation in our lives and relationships.

"We will never be disillusioned or lose our way if we are guided by God."

Here Pope Francis speaks to the heart of faith. When we let God guide our choices — through prayer, trust, and listening to His word — we find a sure compass in life. Francis, ever optimistic, reassures us that placing our lives in God's hands gives light and direction, even amid uncertainties.

"Although the life of a person is a land full of thorns and weeds, there is always a space in which the good seed can grow. You have to trust God."

Acknowledging that every life faces trials and suffering, Pope Francis encourages us not to despair. There is always potential for goodness to take root. If we entrust ourselves to God, His grace can blossom even in our hardest moments. This poetic image of hope in adversity reflects the Pope's constant message that God's love can redeem any situation.

"Let us never forget that authentic power is service."

At his inaugural Mass as Pope, Francis declared that true greatness is found in humble service. He lived this principle daily, showing that the Pope — and indeed every Christian — must imitate Christ, who came not to be served but to serve others. In a world obsessed with power and status, this quote is a powerful reminder that real authority is exercised in love, by tending to the least and the lost.
