



"We Remember"

We remember the countless men and women who have fought in wars in defense of our nation, in the cause of our freedoms, in the pursuit of justice and in the quest for peace. Most of us remember the countless who have fought in wars throughout our history: World War II, Korea, Vietnam, the Gulf, Iraq, Afghanistan and in those places near and far that are in violent conflict, some of which we have never heard of or may not even know where they are. **We remember.**

But we also remember those who have suffered the ravages of war, not with the loss of life, but with bodily injury, like the loss of limbs or illnesses that they continue to endure. We remember also those who are enduring emotional or psychological suffering because of what they experienced on the battleground. So we remember all who have been severely injured, bodily or emotionally. These families' members grieve; they suffer. **We remember.**

As we remember them on this Memorial Day, let us also express our gratitude, we also honor both those who have died and our veterans who are with us. This is honor we express not only by erecting monuments and memorials, by placing flags on their graves, and by visiting cemeteries, but also by the respect and support we give to their loved ones who remain and to our veterans and their families who live among us; by a sincere word of thank you, by our ongoing prayers, and by our own commitment to seek justice which leads to true and lasting peace. **We remember.**

This year, the 4th Degree Knights (also known as the Patriotic Degree) of the St. Francis Assembly have donated a memorial statue (see the front of bulletin) to honor our military men and women. It will be placed near our Memorial Patio & Walkway and at our annual Memorial Day Mass we will offer our blessings and lift up our prayers for those who faithfully served our Country. **We remember.**



Reflection on this weeks reading!



Jesus calls us all to relationship with the Triune God, and with one another. Christ proclaims the three-fold unity of God and commands that we *make disciples of all nations*, baptizing them *in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit*.

In today's first reading, Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40, Moses instructs the people to know, and fix in their hearts, that the Lord is God. They are to keep his statutes and commandments. In Romans, 8:14-17, Paul reminds us that through the Spirit we are God's adopted children and joint heirs with Christ. In the Gospel, Matthew 28:16-20, Jesus delivers the Great Commission, sending his disciples throughout the world to baptize in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Baptism: To schedule a baptism or register for the baptismal preparation program, parents may contact Laurie Seybert. Baptisms may be celebrated during the Masses on the second weekend of each month, except during Lent.

Marriage: Arrangements should be made with Fr. Bob at least one year in advance of your proposed wedding date. No weddings are celebrated during Lent.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Please call the parish office if you are hospitalized or at home and would like a visit from a Eucharistic minister to the homebound, Fr. Bob, or to receive the Anointing of the Sick.

Faith Formation Year in Review

God is good and the fruits of His labor is abundant in the Faith Formation Programs at St. Jude. Here are some of the highlights from our programs this year:

Little Lambs, a weekly story hour, served 14 families and 25 children.

Wee Believers met 3 Sundays a month and welcomed between 15-35 children at each Mass.

During monthly Children's Mass at 8:30am, the youngest members of the parish met with Fr. Bob or Deacon Kevin at the foot of the altar for a homily prepared just for them.

Traditional Elementary Faith Formation was held 26 Sunday mornings for 85 students.

16 families met for monthly gatherings in Family Faith Formation. We had 21 students!

Youth Fusion welcomed 71 students, bi-weekly, for dinner ministry, activity and catechesis.

27 elementary students prepared for and received the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

8 middle school and high school students prepared and received the sacraments of Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

42 high school students were strengthened in the Spirit with Confirmation.
