Feast of Christ the King


November 25, 2018



Christ the King Sunday celebrates the full authority of Christ as King and Lord of the universe. Officially called "The Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ the King," it is celebrated on the last Sunday of Ordinary Time, which is the Sunday before the start of Advent.

Pope Pius XI instituted The Feast of Christ the King in 1925, to be celebrated throughout the universal church, in his encyclical *Quas Primas*. He connected the increasing denial of Christ as king to the rise of secularism throughout much of Europe. At the time of *Quas Primas*, many Christians (including Catholics) began to doubt Christ's authority and existence, as well as the Church's power to continue Christ's authority.

Pius XI, and the rest of the Christian world, witnessed the rise of non-Christian (or nominally Christian) dictatorships throughout Europe, and saw Catholics being persuaded by these earthly leaders. These dictators also often attempted to assert authority over the Church. Just as the Feast of Corpus Christi was instituted when devotion to the Eucharist was at a low point, the Feast of Christ the King was instituted during a time when respect for Christ and the Church was waning, when the feast was needed most.

Four years ago, I walked up to the front of our Church and shouted out this phrase "God is Good", All the Time". Now if you were at those weekend Masses you recognized this opening as I have used this phrase often several times thereafter.

I know that some of you were maybe a bit uncomfortable. That's okay to be uncomfortable because to be a

Christian, to be a Catholic, to believe in Christ is an uncomfortable faith but instead of hiding our faith, we need to take up the challenge to proclaim that faith to others, to give witness of that faith to others.

But it requires us to leave our comfort zone and go out proudly proclaiming our Catholic identity to everyone we meet...we should openly say Grace before meals in public or at the very least make the Sign of the Cross before eating our food. Start small by beginning within the sacred area of our very own worship space with people who profess the same faith! We need to look deep within our hearts and souls and ask if we are really doing all that Christ is calling us to do and if not, we need to step out of our comfort zone and respond whole-heartily to Him in all that we do and proclaim to believe. In other words, we cannot continue to see our faith as a 'private' devotion. For the first 1500 years, the Church went out into the world and brought Christ to the un-churched, the disbelievers, those who had little faith or to those who had faith but doubted it.

Somehow we stopped doing that and what has happen? Our Churches are less packed, our youth have stopped going to Church, many don't practice their faith and even more stopped praying or only pray when something goes wrong.


Just listen to the newscasts, read the paper, really look at the community you live in, the places where you work and even in this Church where you worship. We need to change. Don't get me wrong, I'm not saying that all that we are doing is wrong but people are struggling with their faith, they are struggling with whether a God even exists and it will take all of us to hold it together. So how do we do that?

We start with prayer. Our sacraments are forms of prayer that have built into them communal prayer (praying together), music and song (to inspire us), silence (to let us pray for ourselves), scripture to hear from God in what He is saying to us. So singing, praying and listening together is what we are called to do so that when we leave the Church, we take that Spirit out into the world with us, not to hold onto it as a personal gift, but to share it with those who may need to hear this as well; it might be someone close to us, like our spouse, our children, our family or the stranger we meet.

It is time that we stop being embarrassed or ashamed of our Catholic faith, our Catholic identity. For our identity as a child of God started with our baptism and we were baptized to be priest, prophet and king which means we are all called to be a leader (priest) of faith in our own families or the communities we live in; to go forth and prophesize (prophet) His word and in doing this, we come to share in His Kingship!

Now is the time in this new Liturgical year with the beginning of **Advent** on **December 2nd** to stand up and be counted among the faithful of our Lord and Savior. To be proud of our Baptism into His family and to go prepare ourselves during Advent so that come Christmas, we will go forth into the world for all the nations to proclaim; *Jesus Christ Has Been Born!*

Reflection on this weeks reading!



Next Sunday's Scriptures: A reflection on the readings for Mass next Sunday, December 2.

The Jesus who is born in time and history is also the Christ who will come in glory to judge all.

The season of Advent begins with a call to perseverance and vigilance as we prepare to celebrate not just the historical event of the birth of Jesus of Nazareth, but our central belief that Christ will come again in glory to judge all humanity. Our readings are chosen to help us reflect on this great truth and be prepared for the coming of Christ.

In a time of great upheaval and chaos for Israel, Jeremiah 33:14-16, Jeremiah reassures the people of better days to come, when a descendent of David will rule them with integrity and honesty. Looking forward to the return of Christ in glory, 1 Thessalonians 3:12-4:2, Saint Paul reminds us that we must strive for true holiness now. In the Gospel, Luke 21:25-28, 34-36, Jesus reminds us that no matter what befalls us in this life, we are to have confidence in him, the Son of Man.


