# Music/Choir

"I will *lift my voice* to sing *Your* praise..." (Psalm 59:17)

We need voices and instruments to make our Eucharist the prayerful and spiritual celebration we deserve but it takes you to make this happen. It cannot be left up to Patrick (alone) to do it all especially as we draw closer to the high holy days of Lent and Easter.

Therefore I want to encourage you in being a part of our music and choir programs. I know that in today's world there is so much going on with our families that it is not possible to commit to a set rehearsal day/time. Patrick has also recognized the difficulty of demands that are placed upon our families in today's world and has thus changed the structure for people to take part in our choir or to share their musical instrument talents by asking that you come earlier before the Mass and practice the pieces to be played or sung.

Go to our website and under the **Worship** tab, click on <u>Music Ministry</u> to sign up, or talk with Patrick after one of the Masses.

Everyone should have received their contribution statements from the parish by now but there is something that I want to point out. If you made a contribution to the Diocesan Services Appeal or directly to the diocese for your Witness to Hope pledge, the diocese will be sending out those statements, not the parish. I have not received a statement from the diocese as of yet, but you should be receiving it soon if you have not already.

Also, several people have shared with me that they want to accelerate or pay off their Witness to Hope pledge amount. Please be aware that if you are making payments at witnesstohope.net and would like to pay down your pledge balance, you need to indicate on the website that it is an additional payment and that you would like your current payment arrangement to continue. Otherwise what will happen is your additional payment will be treated as a prepayment and the normal pledge payments will be suspended until the additional payment amount is used up, so to speak. That could alter your charitable giving for the year and cause the pledge term to continue on its original time frame.

It would also be a good idea to contact Colleen or Julie at the diocese to make certain that the transactions are occurring as you want them to be. Their contact number is 517-342-2461. If anyone is experiencing any issues with their Witness to Hope payments or has any questions contact me, Colleen or Julie at the diocese for assistance.


# Next Sunday's Scriptures:

A reflection on the readings for Mass next Sunday, February 10.

With God's grace, let us follow as faithful disciples. Today we consider the encounter between Jesus and Simon, who abandons all to follow the Lord. Like Simon, we are being called little by little, day by day, to say *yes* to Jesus. With God's grace, let us follow as faithful disciples.

The first reading, Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8, recounts the calling of Isaiah, how the seraphim of the Lord came to him with an ember, touched his lips with it, and said, *your wickedness is removed*. In the second reading, 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 or 15:3-8, 11, Paul recounts his own calling by the Lord, and outlines the faith that has been handed on to him, which he now hands on to the Corinthians. In the Gospel, Luke 5:1-11, we hear the account of Jesus' calling to discipleship Simon Peter, James and John.


