BAPTISM:

Arrangements must be made at the Rectory. Sponsors must be practicing Catholics. Parents, and also godparents when possible, must attend the Pre-Baptismal conference which is held on the 1st Tuesday of every month at 7:30pm in the rectory.

CONFESSIONS:

Saturday afternoons 4:30 to 5:15 pm, and anytime at the Rectory.

MARRIAGES:

Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance at the rectory to ensure the date and the hour desired. The Nuptial Mass is the ordinary form of celebrating Christian marriage, and should be strongly considered when making Wedding plans. Attendance at the Pre-Cana Conferences, or the equivalent, is required by the Archbishop.

Central Park West to the Hudson River, from the South side of 77th Street down to the North side of 65th Street.

NEW PARISHIONERS:

We welcome new parishioners, and invite them to register at the Rectory. The registration is our only means of certifying anyone as a member of our parish. If you move to another Parish, or change your address within the Parish, please notify us.

FATIMA DEVOTIONS:

The Rosary is said daily after the 12:10 pm Mass. Friday from 6-7 pm there is a holy hour.

BENEDICTION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT:

First Friday - Exposition: 12:35 pm.
Adoration: All day; Benediction: 5:15 PM.

MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA:

Mondays, before the 12:10 Mass and before the 5:30 pm Mass.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN AND TEENAGERS:

Classes in Religion for Catholic children/teenagers, Pre-kindergarten - High School take place on Sundays. The Family Mass begins at 10:00 a.m. in the Church followed by class instruction in the school.

Ongoing religious education is important for the religious development of your children. First Communion and Confirmation require a two year program.

Dear parishioners and friends,

I would like to share with you these words of Pope Francis on patience...

I see holiness in the patience of the people of God: a woman who is raising children, a man who works to bring home the bread, the sick, the elderly priests who have so many wounds but have a smile on their faces because they served the Lord, the sisters who work hard and live a hidden sanctity. This is for me the common sanctity. I often associate sanctity with patience: not only patience as taking charge of the events and circumstances of life, but also a constancy in forward, day by day. This is the sanctity of the militant church also mentioned by St. Ignatius. This was the sanctity of my parents: my dad, my mom, my grandmother Rosa who loved me so much. In my Breviary I have the last will of my grandmother Rosa, and I read it often. For me it is like a prayer. She is a saint who has suffered so much, also spiritually, and yet always went forward with courage.

On a practical note, I would urge you, if you have not done so, to register in the parish. Someone asked if they could register because they lived outside the boundaries of the parish. Yes, you can and should! You choose the parish community in which you find yourself able to worship and experience God's presence and activity.

War- how frightening to think of it- but day after day- word/tweet after tweet- it appears all too much a frightening possibility. Do we want to give up our young?

Everyday please pray and work for peace. Monday night in church will be a very special evening with Trappist Monk Father William Meninger presenting on "The Loving Search for God in an Age of Discontent." Try to be a part of this if you can.

A special thanks to Rebecca Painter who began the

parish film festival this past week with the screening of the first part of the series Decalog...I know that a lively discussion took place after the film, and I encourage you to attend the rest of the series if possible.

Me gustaría compartir con ustedes estas palabras del Papa Francisco sobre la paciencia ...

Veo la santidad en la paciencia del pueblo de Dios: una mujer que está criando sus hijos, un hombre que trabaja para traer a casa el pan de cada día, los enfermos, los sacerdotes ancianos que tienen tantas heridas pero tienen una sonrisa en la cara porque le han servido al Señor, las hermanas que trabajan duro y viven una santidad oculta. Esta es para mí la santidad común. A menudo asocio la santidad con la paciencia: no solo la paciencia haciéndose cargo de los acontecimientos y las circunstancias de la vida, sino también una constancia hacia delante, día a día. Esta es la santidad de la iglesia militante también mencionada por San Ignacio. Esta fue la santidad de mis padres: mi papá, mi mamá, mi abuela Rosa, que me amaba tanto. En mi Breviario tengo aun la última voluntad de mi abuela Rosa, y la leo a menudo. Para mí es como una oración. Ella es una santa que ha sufrido tanto, también espiritualmente, y, sin embargo, siempre avanzó con coraje.

Les pido, si no lo han hecho, que se registren en la parroquia. Alguien nos preguntó si podían registrarse aunque vivieran fuera de los límites de la misma. Sí, pueden y deben! Ustedes eligen la comunidad parroquial en la que se encuentren capaz de orar y experimentar la presencia y la actividad de Dios.

La Guerra: cuán aterrador es pensar en ello, pero día tras día, palabra tras palabra, twitt tras twitt, parece una posibilidad aterradora. ¿Queremos renunciar y entregar a nuestros jóvenes?

Les ruego que todos los días oren y trabajen por la paz.
