

**BAPTISM:** Arrangements must be made at the Rectory. Sponsors must be practicing Catholics. Parents, and also godparents when possible, must attend the Pre-Baptismal conference which is held on the 1st Tuesday of every month at 7:30pm in the rectory.

**CONFESSIONS:** Saturday afternoons 4:30 to 5:15 pm, and anytime at the Rectory.

**MARRIAGES:** Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance at the rectory to ensure the date and the hour desired. The Nuptial Mass is the ordinary form of celebrating Christian marriage, and should be strongly considered when making Wedding plans. Attendance at the Pre-Cana Conferences, or the equivalent, is required by the Archbishop.

**PARISH BOUNDARIES:** Central Park West to the Hudson River, from the South side of 77th Street down to the North side of 65th Street.

**NEW PARISHIONERS:** We welcome new parishioners, and invite them to register at the Rectory. The registration is our only means of certifying anyone as a member of our parish. If you move to another Parish, or change your address within the Parish, please notify us.

**FATIMA DEVOTIONS:** The Rosary is said daily after the 12:10 pm Mass. Friday from 6-7 pm there is a holy hour.

**BENEDICTION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT:** First Friday - Exposition: 12:35 pm. Adoration: All day; Benediction: 5:15 PM.

**MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA:** Mondays, before the 12:10 Mass and before the 5:30 pm Mass.

**RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN AND TEENAGERS:** Classes in Religion for Catholic children/teenagers, Pre- kindergarten - High School take place on Sundays. The Family Mass begins at 10:00 a.m. in the Church followed by class instruction in the school.

Ongoing religious education is important for the religious development of your children. First Communion and Confirmation require a two year program.

## Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time - July 28th, 2019

### PARISH NEWS / NOTICIAS PARROQUIALES

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The peace the Lord offers us and guarantees us is not to be understood as the absence of worry, of disappointment, of failure, of reasons for suffering. If it were so, supposing we had managed to be at peace, that moment would end quickly, and we would inevitably fall prey to unease. The peace that springs from faith is a gift: it is the grace of feeling that God loves us and that he is always beside us; he does not leave us on our own even for a moment of our life. This generates patience, because we know that, even at the hardest and most disturbing moment, the Lord's mercy and goodness are greater than everything, and nothing will tear us from his hands and from communion with him. Monday, the Church honors Saint Martha, sister of Mary and Lazarus of Bethany. In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus visits the home of Martha and Mary, and it is here where Jesus contrasts their difference approaches to his visit. Martha is concerned with the many practical things of making Jesus' stay hospitable and comfortable, while Mary's concern is to sit with Jesus and remain in his presence. Both have validity, both reveal something about the life of Faith. In the Gospel of John, Martha is witness to the resuscitation of her brother Lazarus. Again in this scene Martha and Mary are contrasted, as Martha goes out immediately to see Jesus, while Mary waits home until she is called.

Wednesday of this week the Church honors St. Ignatius of Loyola, the founder of the Jesuit order, the Society of Jesus. Born into a noble family in Spain in 1491, the youngest of thirteen children, Ignatius desired a life of knighthood, and was in essence a soldier. Wounded in battle, Ignatius was bed ridden for quite some time, and it was during that time that he read both the Life of Christ and the Lives of the Saints. Ignatius' ideal of serving a great leader in battle began to take on a deeper, more spiritual calling. Like Saint Martha, Ignatius felt called to lead the life of a more active apostolate, which evolved into missionary work and a thriving teaching apostolate. Today the Jesuit Order numbers almost 16,000 priests, brothers, and scholastics (students in formation) worldwide.

Thursday, the Church honors St. Alphonsus Liguori, who founded the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (Redemptorists) in 1732. St. Alphonsus. As a young priest, St. Alphonsus took to the streets of Naples, ministering to the poor, orphaned and widows, and was known for his very simple but effective preaching. His ministry is known to have helped many people understand and begin to live more fully the Gospel way of life.

Pray for peace.

*Queridos Feligreses y Amigos;*

Esto genera paciencia, porque sabemos que, incluso en el momento más difícil y perturbador, la misericordia y la bondad del Señor son mayores que todo, y nada nos arrancará de sus manos y de la comunión con él. *El lunes, la Iglesia honra a Santa Marta, hermana de María y Lázaro de Betania. En el Evangelio de Lucas, Jesús visita el hogar de Marta y María, y es aquí donde Jesús contrasta sus diferencias con respecto a su visita. A Marta le preocupan las muchas cosas prácticas y hacer que la estancia de Jesús sea hospitalaria y cómoda, mientras que la preocupación de María es sentarse con Jesús y permanecer en su presencia. Ambos tienen validez, ambos revelan algo sobre la vida de la fe. En el Evangelio de Juan, Marta es testigo de la reanimación de su hermano Lázaro. Nuevamente en esta escena, se contrasta a Marta y María, ya que Marta sale inmediatamente a ver a Jesús, mientras que María espera en casa hasta que la llamen.*

*El miércoles de esta semana, la Iglesia honra a San Ignacio de Loyola, el fundador de la orden jesuita, la Compañía de Jesús. Nacido en una familia noble en España en 1491, el más joven de trece hijos, Ignacio deseaba una vida de caballero, y era en esencia un soldado. Herido en batalla, Ignacio estuvo en cama durante bastante tiempo, y fue durante ese tiempo que leyó la Vida de Cristo y la Vida de los Santos. El ideal de Ignacio de servir a un gran líder en la batalla comenzó a asumir un llamamiento más profundo y más espiritual. Al igual que Santa Marta, Ignacio se sintió llamado a llevar la vida de un apostolado más activo, que evolucionó hacia un trabajo misionero y un apostolado de enseñanza. Hoy en día, la Orden de los Jesuitas cuenta con casi 16,000 sacerdotes, hermanos y escolásticos (estudiantes en formación) en todo el mundo.*

*El jueves, la Iglesia honra a San Alfonso Liguori, quien fundó la Congregación del Santísimo Redentor (Redentoristas) en 1732. Joven sacerdote, San Alfonso tomó las calles de Nápoles, atendiendo a los pobres, huérfanos y viudas, y fue conocido por predicar simple pero efectiva. Se sabe que su ministerio ayudó a muchas personas a comprender y comenzar a vivir más plenamente el modo de vida del Evangelio.*
