

SPANISH WEEKDAY MASS:
Every 1st and 3rd Wednesday of Month at 7:00 PM

BAPTISM: Arrangements must be made at the Rectory.
Sponsors must be practicing Catholics. Parents, and also
godparents when possible, must attend the Pre-Baptismal
conference which is held on the 1st Monday of every month at
6:30pm in the rectory.

CONFESSIONS: Saturday afternoons 4:30 to 5:15 pm, and
anytime at the Rectory.

MARRIAGES: Arrangements should be made at least six
months in advance at the rectory to ensure the date and the
hour desired. The Nuptial Mass is the ordinary form of
celebrating Christian marriage, and should be strongly
considered when making Wedding plans. Attendance at the
Pre-Cana Conferences, or the equivalent, is required by the
Archbishop.

PARISH BOUNDARIES: Central Park West to the Hudson
River, from the South side of 77th Street down to the North
side of 65th Street.

NEW PARISHIONERS: We welcome new parishioners, and
invite them to register at the Rectory. The registration is our
only means of certifying anyone as a member of our parish. If

Parish, please notify us.


FATIMA DEVOTIONS: The Rosary is said daily after the




The Gospel of Saint Matthew


