CONFESSIONS: Saturday afternoons 4:30 to 5:15 pm, and anytime at the Rectory.

MARRIAGES: Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance at the rectory to ensure the date and the hour desired. The Nuptial Mass is the ordinary form of celebrating Christian marriage, and should be strongly considered when making Wedding plans. Attendance at the Pre-Cana Conferences, or the equivalent, is required by the Archbishop.

PARISH BOUNDARIES: Central Park West to the Hudson River, from the South side of 77th Street down to the North side of 65th Street.

NEW PARISHIONERS: We welcome new parishioners, and invite them to register at the Rectory. The registration is our only means of certifying anyone as a member of our parish. If you move to another Parish, or change your address within the Parish, please notify us.

### Season of Creation: A call for ecological conversion

Last week in SEGMENT 1, Pope Francis explained the history of the Season of Creation and introduced this year's theme: Listening to the Voice of Creation.

ACTION during this 2nd Week of the Season of Creation, strive to humbly reconnect with the natural world of which humans are but one species, no greater or lesser in importance than any other. See, hear, and smell the things of nature – big and small – as you walk in your urban, suburban, or rural environment. Pay special attention to any wildlife you may encounter especially those "speaking" to you or making eye contact. Set aside time to study the special purpose each creature has in maintaining the delicate balance in the interconnected web of life. Make St. Francis' "Canticle of Creation" and also e.e. cummings' poem "i thank you God" part of this week's prayers.

### **SEGMENT 2**

The sweet song of creation invites us to practice an "ecological spirituality" (Laudato Si', 216) attentive to God's presence in the natural world. It is a summons to base our spirituality on the "loving awareness that we are not disconnected from the rest of creatures, but joined in a splendid universal communion" (ibid., 220). For the followers of Christ in particular, this luminous experience reinforces our awareness that "all things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being" (Jn 1:3). In this Season of Creation, we pray once more in the great cathedral of creation, and revel in the "grandiose cosmic choir" made up of countless creatures, all singing the praises of God. Let us join Saint Francis of Assisi in singing: "Praise be to you, my Lord, for all your creatures" (cf. Canticle of Brother Sun). Let us join the psalmist in singing, "Let everything that breathes praise the Lord!" (Ps 150:6).


