Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

I have a close friend who tends to use the word "awesome" a bit more than I prefer. He applies the adjective to everything from a plate of sushi to a ski slope. Friendship trumps grammar, and I would never want to be a curmudgeonly ex-English teacher. So I offer him neither correction nor suggestion. But I did think of my friend's habit as I pondered the Passion of Jesus, and thought to myself: "How awesome!"

This account of God's unparalleled love for us almost baffles the mind, and brings to light how puny our response often is. Or how quickly and often we forget what Jesus endured for our sake.

We know deep down that the lesser characters in the drama act as stand-ins for us and how we act. We betray Him. We deny Him. We run from Him. We're there in the crowd that shouts "Crucify Him!" to Pilate. Maybe often; Maybe seldom. But we do these things in our relationship with God. We need His mercy to survive and start over.

Our guilt is assuaged somewhat by those stout hearts and loyal followers who stayed with Jesus to the end. They were mostly women, who dare us from their vantage point at the foot of the cross, to call them "the weaker sex." Mary His Mother, "Tower of gold and ivory" stands among them, bloodied from His wounds.

The Church holds us back today from letting us hear officially about the events of Easter morning. We stop reading at the point in the gospel where Pilate lets the chief priests and the Pharisees use his soldiers as a guard at the temporary tomb of God.

We will wait out the week ahead and recall and honor the events that will come. The Holy Eucharist and the new priesthood will originate before the nails get driven into His hands and feet. We will watch in our minds' eyes as the story is read to us twenty-one centuries afterward. We will be stunned to see the dark side in each of us contrasted sharply with the holiness of the Nazarene. We will perhaps hear with our imagination the words and music of Handel's "Messiah" as background for our meditation. But at certain points this week we will be compelled to silence in the face of what happened before Easter. It is Holy Week, and it is entirely... awesome.

Starting with the Passion Sunday blessing of palms we enter Holy Week, the most sacred time of the Church year. While many attend the Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday celebrations, there is so much more that transpires during this week. If you have not done so in the past and are able to attend the Holy Week celebrations, I would certainly invite you to do so.

On Monday, March 21st the **Chrism Mass**, at which the blessing of the holy oils and the sacred Chrism used in the sacraments, will be celebrated at 7PM at St. Robert Bellarmine Church in Freehold. Bishop David O'Connell is the principal celebrant, assisted by many of the diocesan priests and attended by people throughout the diocese – it is truly a wonderful experience in the solidarity of the local Church of Trenton to see so many turn out in common celebration.

On Holy Thursday, March 24th we celebrate the **Mass of the Lord's Supper** in Visitation church at 7:30PM. This marks the end of Lent and the start of the Easter Triduum (meaning "three days") commemorating the Paschal Mystery (the suffering, death and resurrection) of Jesus. The Thursday evening Mass observes the *Mandatum* (the washing of the feet) as we remember Jesus instituting the Sacrament of the Eucharist, as a parish we formally receive the oils blessed at Monday's Chrism Mass, and follow with the Procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the Garden of Repose and silent adoration.

On Good Friday, March 25th (a day of fasting and abstinence) the **Commemoration of the Lord's Passion and Death** will be held at 3PM in Visitation. This special service (celebration of Masses are forbidden by the Church on Good Friday and on Holy Saturday before the Easter Vigil) vividly recalls Jesus suffering for our sins. Silent veneration of the Cross follows.

On Holy Saturday, March 26th, we mark the Resurrection with the most glorious celebration of the Church: the **Easter Vigil Mass** at 8PM. Beginning with the blessing of the Easter fire and the Celebration of Light, we recount the salvation history – of which we are a part – that culminates with the Light of the World, Jesus Christ himself.

Consider taking part in any or all of these celebrations, as well as the opportunities for 8AM Morning Prayer or 8PM Tenebrae services (the Liturgy of the Hours – the "prayer of the Church") or the blessing of Food for Easter at 1:30PM on Holy Saturday. There's so much that happens between Palm and Easter Sunday; make it extra-special this year and be a part of it!

COMFORT THE SORROWFUL

"Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep." (Rom 12:16)

In dealing with comforting the sorrowful we must keep in mind that actions speak louder than words. What words of comfort can we offer someone, especially if we haven't experienced the same form of suffering? It is better to offer our tears and our prayers. St. Francis of Assisi's instructions on preaching the Gospel says: "Preach the Gospel always and when absolutely necessary, use words." Preaching and teaching can take on many forms. In dealing with those who grieve maybe we can't find the right word, because no word is needed. Exercising the virtue of comfort to me then means to be present no matter what is going on with the sorrowful.

Does it take the right word or the write phrase to comfort those who are mourning? No, sometimes it is just our presence with them that offers consolation. We actually could never find the right words. So it is best just not to desert the person who grieves.

The focus of St. Paul's instruction is to always be yourself. Jesus stands as our model. No matter who the suffering is, we must resist the urge to flee. Maybe all we can offer is our prayer and that in itself is good. Any kind of human kindness and contact works to assist the grieving person.

It is helpful for us to understand that grief is the natural, normal, but necessary response to loss. It is a physical, social, emotional and spiritual reaction. It may cause a variety of reactions including irritability, inability to sleep or wanting to sleep all the time. Grief affects the appetite; some people feel hungry all the time or may not feel hungry at all. It is normal for them to experience feelings of anxiousness. Some people say that they feel like their heart is racing or they can't catch their breath, some people find it difficult to breathe and feel empty inside. It is difficult for grieving individuals to concentrate on things. Grieving people feel helpless, angry and frightened. Our patience is required. Keep in mind that grief takes time to heal. But remaining with the one who grieves will be a fruitful endeavor on your part. To show mercy is one of the greatest gifts we can accomplish. To those who show mercy, mercy shall be shown. Remember grief takes time.

LENTEN REGULATIONS

ABSTINENCE from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old and older on, Good Friday.

FASTING is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.



On Good Friday our Parish will take up the annual collection for the Holy Land. Your help is needed to protect the Holy Places of the Holy Land. BLESSED PALMS: A SYMBOL OF TRIUMPH

Blessed palms, an ancient symbol of victory, are distributed in memory of Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem at the beginning of the Palm Sunday liturgy. On this day, we are reminiscent of the saints in heaven "wearing white robes and holding palm branches in their hands" (Rev 7:9). The white robes remind us of baptismal garments, and the palms suggest their triumph over sin and death through the waters of Baptism. Palms may be saved until the following year when they can be burned into ashes for use on Ash Wednesday.

Palm Sunday also marks the start of Holy Week whereby Lent comes to an end before the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. That liturgy begins the Triduum, the great Three Days that celebrate the central mystery of our faith. Triduum rituals invite us all to baptismal renewal, for example:

Washing of Feet: After the homily on Holy Thursday, we imitate our Master in the washing of feet. We are reminded of our baptismal commitment to be servants of one another. Jesus' words to Peter: "Whoever has bathed has no need except to have his feet washed" (Jn 13:10). Many scholars have seen a baptismal reference in those words.

Veneration of the Cross: As part of our observance of Good Friday, we venerate the cross on which Christ died. The veneration challenges us to be willing to accept the cross, too, for it is the only way to resurrection. Through Baptism, we shared in Christ's death that we might come to new life. We are called to identify with his cross and resurrection.

Waters of Baptism: The core of our celebration of the Easter Vigil is the Baptism of the elect. As we share in their joy on this holy night, we are to renew our own baptismal promises, to live in the joy of life in the Risen One. Lent comes to its fulfillment around the waters of the font.

Jesus is obedient to His Father's Will; He does not refuse to serve and suffer for our sins. His only moment of glory on earth was riding into Jerusalem on a donkey. As He entered Jerusalem, the acclamation of the people, "Hosanna to the Son of David. Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord," (Matt 21:9) clearly reveal that Jesus was hailed as the Messianic King. Yet only days later, our Lord would hear the cry "Crucify!" (Matt. 27:22-23) Pope John Paul II observed in his book, Crossing the Threshold of Hope, that God would go to any lengths to draw us close to Him: "Could God go further in His stooping down, in His drawing near to man, thereby expanding the possibilities of our knowing Him? In truth it seems that he has gone as far as possible. He could not go further. In a certain sense, God has gone too far!"

We too are called upon to serve and do God's Will. Sometimes the demands on us are so great that we find it very difficult to do so. Jesus says to trust and to call on Him. He will be present in our moment of need. Jesus invites us into a close relationship with Himself. He invites us to find time in our life to pray, so that we stay in touch with Him. More than anything else, our daily moments of prayer, our brief but regular going aside with Him, enables us to do even that one more thing.

Palm Sunday should be celebrated, not as a commemoration of an historical event, but as an archetypal mystery and another step in the process of psychological and spiritual transformation. We need to have faith and trust and know that God's power is at work. Faith and trust in Christ will help us to break down the walls of frustration, worry and anxiety. Let us call upon Him today to come into our life. Say, "Yes Lord, whatever Your will is Lord, I will do my best to comply." Be my Lord and my peacemaker.
