Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

(Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review, and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Reflections for The Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel concludes three weeks of readings from the 13th Chapter of Matthew's Gospel. Throughout these three weeks we have heard Jesus teaching crowds about the kingdom of heaven, and we have heard Jesus interpret some of his teachings for the disciples. In this week's Gospel, Jesus offers three more short parables.

The first two parables describe the great value of the kingdom of heaven. In the first parable, Jesus says that the kingdom of heaven is like a buried treasure that is worth possessing even if it means giving up everything else. In the second parable, Jesus proposes that the kingdom of heaven is like a pearl of great worth for which one will sell everything else to possess. These parables teach us that we are to place everything we value in the service of the pursuit of the Kingdom of God.

The third parable that Jesus proposes in today's Gospel is different from the first two, but it is reminiscent of the parable of the sower heard in last week's Gospel. The kingdom of heaven is compared to fishing with a wide net. After the fish have been collected, the good fish are kept and the bad fish are thrown away; so too, in the final judgment, will the wicked and the righteous be separated.

Today's Gospel concludes with a curious statement about the scribe who understands the kingdom of heaven. Here a metaphor is offered: this scribe is like the head of a household who "brings from his storeroom both the new and the old." The scribes referred to here are experts of Mosaic law. It is possible that Jesus is here instructing the early Christian community on how to proceed in the interpretation of Jewish law with respect to Jesus' "new" teaching. Jesus' teaching about the kingdom of heaven does not replace the Jewish tradition; it interprets it in a different light.

As I continue to come across news items that misinterpret Church teaching and statements from Pope Francis, I'm reminded of a quote that came out soon after his election and started this unfortunate trend: "...who am I to judge?" This statement from the Holy Father in 2013 caused a lot of discussion and, since then, has been used by many who oppose Church teaching as justification in attacking those who hold to those teachings. How are we to conduct ourselves as Catholics in such a situation?

Part of our struggle may come from misunderstanding the meaning of the word "judgment". Making a judgment is not necessarily good or bad. As defined by the *Merriam-Webster Dictionary*, a judgment is "an opinion or decision that is based on careful thought; the act or process of forming an opinion or making a decision after careful thought; the ability to make good decisions about what should be done." The distinction must be made between forming an opinion directed at a *person* versus one directed at an *action* or *situation*. In the Gospel according to Matthew, Jesus says "Stop judging, that you may not be judged." (Matt. 7:1) However, if we applied this in the way that radical activists wish to paint those upholding Christ's teaching, Jesus himself was a frequent violator: he held back no scorn of scribes and Pharisees who felt comfortable in their own righteousness and failed to see their need of the divine Physician (Matt. 9:12; Mark 2:17; Luke 5:31) – something that *all* of us need to reach the Kingdom of Heaven.

This doesn't mean that we cannot recognize the faults of others but against passing judgment in a spirit of arrogance, forgetful of one's own faults. In other words, it is not a contradiction to avoid passing judgment on a person while still recognizing that there are actions and situations that are objectively sinful and outside of natural law and God's Divine Plan. We are always called to "Love the sinner, not the sin" and Christ is our example of making judgments, without being unduly judgmental. When He faced an angry crowd judging an adulteress, He told them that whoever among them who had not sinned should be the first to throw a stone. When the crowd departed without a single stone thrown, He told the woman that He did not judge her either; however, he also said "Go and sin no more" (John 8:11). Christ loved the person in front of Him, but this did not keep Him from speaking the truth about the need to avoid sin.

This is what Pope Francis meant when he made his famous statement above. He drew a distinction between someone who identifies as gay and one who is leading an objectively disordered lifestyle. Regarding a person who identifies as gay, Francis' full quote was, "A gay person who is seeking God, who is of good will — well, who am I to judge him?" Note that the Holy Father did not say that the acts are not sinful. Like Christ, he was talking about the judgment of a person — in this case, a person of good will who is seeking God. We are called to do the same.
