(Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

#### Baptism

### <u>Marriages</u>

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon. Focus review, and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. 

# Reflections for Twenty Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time



Matthew sets up an unusual partnership between the Pharisees and the Herodians. The Herodians were supporters of Herod Antipas, a Jewish political leader who collaborated with the Romans. Such collaboration would have required a compromised observance of the Mosaic Law. The Pharisees, on the other hand, taught scrupulous observance of the Mosaic Law and opposed Roman occupation. Herodians favored the payment of taxes; the Pharisees opposed it. The Herodians and the Pharisees approach Jesus, asking that he take sides in their dispute. If Jesus answers with the Pharisees, he shows himself to be an enemy of Rome. If he answers with the Herodians, he offends popular Jewish religious sensibilities.

Jesus' response to this attempt to trap him exposes the guile of his questioners. From his first words to them, Jesus shows that he is very much aware of what they are trying to do. He asks to see a Roman coin, which is readily provided to him. It may have come from the hand of a Herodian, but the Pharisees show themselves to be quite willing to accept this compromise. Jesus has already exposed the Pharisees as hypocrites.

Jesus takes his response one step further. He asks that his questioners examine the coin. Agreeing that it is Caesar's image on the coin, Jesus tells them that it must belong to Caesar. Avoiding the question of lawfulness altogether, Jesus answers their question with simple logic. Then, going further still, Jesus tells them that their obligation is to pay to God that which belongs to God.

Jesus' response to the Herodians and Pharisees suggests the ethic that Christians ought to adopt. It reminds us of the importance of keeping things in their proper perspective. Do we attach ourselves to worldly things at the expense of the love and honor that we owe to God?

### *OCTOBER 22, 2017*



This weekend is **World Mission Sunday**. We recognized it with a special collection for world missions, but there is so much more to it. Through the Diocese of Trenton's Society for the Propagation of the Faith, we are reminded that our church activity is far more than the time we spend in the church building on Sunday – it is a mission. As followers of Christ we remember the last earthly words to the Apostles before Jesus' Ascension into heaven: "Go, therefore, and *make disciples of all nations*, *baptizing* them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, *teaching* them to observe all that I have commanded you" (Matthew 28:19-29, *italics mine*).

In true Pope Francis style, the Holy Father reiterates this in his recent letter for World Mission Sunday: "The Church's mission is enlivened by a spirituality of constant exodus. We are challenged 'to go forth from our own comfort zone in order to reach all the peripheries in need of the light of the Gospel' (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 20). The Church's mission impels us to undertake a constant pilgrimage across the various deserts of life, through the different experiences of hunger and thirst for truth and justice. The Church's mission inspires a sense of constant exile, to make us aware, in our thirst for the infinite, that we are exiles journeying towards our final home, poised between the 'already' and 'not yet' of the Kingdom of Heaven. (*Pope Francis 2017 letter*, "*Mission at the heart of the Christian faith*", 6).

Although not all of us might participate in this missionary calling of the Church through travel, we are bound to so in other ways, such as prayer and financial support. However, our most direct and effective participation may be through our witness and reflection of the actions of Christ in our own lives, the way we let the "light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father" (Matthew 5:16).

In our own way, each of us is called to be a missionary; let's do so the best that we can!



### **ORDINARY TIME: AUTUMN**

# A Sense of the Season



All of our days are numbered. Now that Christ has risen from the dead and ascended into heaven, we count down the days until he returns in glory to judge the living and the dead. Ordinary Time is "ordinal" time: numbered days, days in which we lay out the scriptures and the prayers to bide our time until Christ returns.

Although the church makes no official distinction between the days of Ordinary Time from Pentecost until Advent, in our lives we experience the subtle shift from the relaxed days of summer to the increasingly active days of autumn. For some of us, the shift comes with the end-of-summer holiday or the beginning of school. Others see work activities shift, from tending to harvesting, from stocking shelves to increasing sales, from cashing out an old fiscal year to digging into a new one.

The church's calendar contains some subtle shifts, too. On September 14 we celebrated the Holy Cross, and the waning of the natural world around us points us to the mystery of suffering

and redemption. At the end of September we invoked the holy archangels to guard us in the encroaching twilight. And if we listen closely to the scriptures in October, we begin to hear talk of the last days and the final things. These thoughts reach their culmination with the great festival of saints and souls, November 1 and 2. And we spend November remembering the dead, preparing for the end and celebrating Christ, the first fruits harvested of the new creation, the firstborn from the dead.

This is the extraordinary opportunity that autumn's Ordinary Time opens up for us.
