

Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 11:00 Mass at 12:30 PM. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

<u>Marriages</u>

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review, and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

This is the process by which adults become full, active, participating members of the Catholic Church. Please call Dale Zanetti at ext. 214 for more information.

Anointing of the Sick

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for an extended period. In an emergency call the Parish office anytime.

Reflections for Seventh Sunday of Easter



Today's reading is a prayer, which appears at the conclusion of Jesus' Last Supper discourse. At the end of the prayer, Jesus is arrested in the garden. The prayer might be read as Jesus' final commendation of himself to the Father. In the prayer, Jesus also expresses care and concern for his disciples.

Jesus' prayer reaffirms the complete union between Jesus and the Father. Throughout John's Gospel, Jesus has been presented as the Word, who pre-existed with the Father and was sent to do the Father's work on earth. In this prayer we learn that Jesus' life and ministry have been directed toward one purpose, revealing the Father. When this work is accomplished, Jesus is to return to the Father to be glorified. Regardless of what happens to Jesus, in John's Gospel, Jesus and the Father are in charge. Even in the description of Jesus' death, Jesus does not simply die but instead hands over his spirit.

In today's Gospel we also note the distinction found in John's Gospel between the world and the disciples. The disciples are in the world, but they are separate from it because they have been given to Jesus. They are chosen from the world to be in service to the world for its salvation. This salvation has been accomplished in Jesus because Jesus has revealed the Father to the world, but the disciples will be sent by Jesus to make both the Father and Jesus known to the world. Guidelines for Outdoor Reception of Holy Communion

To best manage traffic flow, enter the parking lot from the Mantoloking Road entrance only – the Lynnwood and Barber Avenue entrances will be blocked off.

The following conditions should be observed:

- If you are not feeling well, STAY HOME
- Be a Catholic and properly disposed to receive (still applies)
- Observe the one-hour Eucharistic Fast prior to receiving (unless impeded due to health)
- Call to mind any sins and make an act of Contrition
- Pray the *Our Father* and receive Holy Communion
- Communion will be offered in the hand ONLY; please make sure that your hands are clean
- Per NJ state law, face masks must be worn while in close proximity with the Minister of Holy Communion; immediately after saying "Amen" you may pull down the mask.
- Extend your hands outside the car window, ONE HAND ON TOP OF THE OTHER
- After receiving Communion, please do not engage in conversation
- It is suggested to offer the following prayer after Communion: Almighty and ever-living God, may the Body and Blood of Christ your Son be for us a lasting remedy for body and soul, through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Communion will be offered, following the Sunday 9;00 AM live-streamed Mass, from 10;00 until 10:30AM.

In any case, although the obligation to attend Mass continues to be suspended, vou are strongly encouraged to either watch the live-streamed Mass (www.youtube.com/VisitationRomanCatholicChurch) or a Mass broadcast on television. Please note that the above information is current as of 5/21 Thursday morning (when the bulletin is submitted) and some of it may have changed since then. The Diocese of Trenton has issued an alert regarding reports of email and text scams that will use the name of a pastor to solicit funds in the form of gift cards or cash donations. Most recently, emails are going out from the Bishop as well. The email usually begins with a simple "Hi," but no recipients' name, and asks for financial help for a worthy cause. The pastor's name concludes the email. Several pastors in the Diocese of Trenton have already heard from parishioners who received emails or text messages, seemingly from the pastor, asking for donations. The Diocese takes this opportunity to advise parishioners that pastors do not raise money in this manner and to exercise the utmost caution when receiving this type of communication. Some law enforcement in the area urge parishioners to question any email or text that doesn't come from a person in their contacts. If the person is not known, a parishioner should call the person asking for funds to verify the story. If a pastor's name is used, parishioners should contact the parish to verify the legitimacy of the appeal. Anyone who feels that they have been the victim of this type of scam is urged to contact their local police department.

This is a time when we must all be on high alert for the many scams that are arising during this pandemic. Remember, it's ok to question anyone who calls, texts or emails you especially when they are requesting money, gifts cards or any of the like.
