

#### Parish Registration

The Church of the Visitation is obliged to serve and minister to all baptized Catholics living in our local area. PLEASE REGISTER - it assists the staff in knowing you as a parishioner, providing for your needs, informing you of parish programs and activities, and utilizing your gifts and talents in service of the Church and one another. Envelopes for weekly contributions are available to you once you are registered. Please contact the rectory ext. 201 to register.

#### **Sacramental Sponsor Certificates**

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

#### **Baptism**

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at 732-477-7059 ext. 218 to make arrangements.

#### Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review, and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at 732-477-7059 ext. 218 to make arrangements.

#### Anointing of the Sick

Please notify the Parish Office when serious illness occurs and when the sick, aged, or incapacitated are confined to home for an extended period. In an emergency call the Parish office ext. 201 anytime.

Reflections for The Second Sunday of Lent



On the second Sunday of Lent, we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert and temptation by the devil to the glory shown in Jesus' Transfiguration.

The Transfiguration occurs after Peter's confession that Jesus is the Messiah and Jesus' prediction about his Passion. This

occurs on a mountain in the presence of just three of Jesus' disciples—Peter, James and John. These are among the first disciples that Jesus called in Luke's Gospel. We recently heard this Gospel at Mass, on the fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time. Only Luke's Gospel, which often describes Jesus at prayer, indicates that Jesus is praying as his appearance changes to bright white. Luke indicates that the three disciples were sleeping while Jesus prayed. They will be sleeping again as Jesus prays in the Garden of Gethsemane before his Passion and death.

As they awake, Peter and the disciples see Jesus Transfigured and Elijah and Moses present with Jesus. Elijah and Moses, both significant figures in the history of Israel, represent Jesus' continuity with the Law and the Prophets. In Matthew's and Mark's Gospels, there is reference to conversation among Jesus, Elijah, and Moses, but only Luke's Gospel explains that this conversation is about Jesus' later accomplishments in Jerusalem. Luke describes this as his exodus, connecting Jesus' Passion, death, and Resurrection with the Israel's Exodus from Egypt.

On witnessing Jesus' Transfiguration and seeing Jesus with Elijah and Moses, Peter offers to construct three tents for them. Having just awoken, perhaps Peter's offer was made in confusion. We also notice that Peter reverted from his earlier confession that Jesus is the Messiah, calling Jesus "master" instead. As if in reply to Peter's confusion, a voice from heaven speaks, affirming Jesus as God's Son and commanding that the disciples listen to him. This voice from heaven recalls the voice that was heard at Jesus' baptism which, in Luke's Gospel, spoke directly to Jesus as God's Son.

In his Transfiguration, we see an anticipation of the glory of Jesus' Resurrection. In each of the reports of the Transfiguration, the disciples keep secret what they have seen. Not until they also witness his Passion and death will the disciples understand Jesus' Transfiguration. We hear this story of Jesus' Transfiguration early in Lent, but we have the benefit of hindsight. In our hearing of it, we anticipate Jesus' Resurrection even as we prepare to remember Jesus' Passion and death.

I know that people have been quite frustrated with the issues surrounding the upcoming sale of property owned by Visitation Parish. Much of that frustration stems from an incomplete understanding of what is happening and why. I also know that many people in the news and social media areas (which, increasingly as the court of public opinion, have become judge, jury and executioner in so many matters) have come to their own conclusions on the situation based on what they've heard – with an extraordinary amount of that understanding based on made up "facts" that have suddenly become reality! However, responding in kind is something that the Diocese and parish simply will not do and that is why the response has not been made as quickly as some would like. We are taking great care to ensure that all aspects of our response have been carefully documented and can be properly defended when the Brick Township Planning Board meets again on March 21<sup>st</sup>. One important part of that response is making it clear that this was not suddenly "sprung" on everybody. As Pastor, my primary concern is that Visitation parishioners were aware of this, so I am reprinting here a portion of *my Bulletin letter from July 28*, *2019*. The Faith Formation Center. Before a firm action plan could be presented to the parish, we needed to procure monies to supplement the already collected (and still held in account!) Capital Campaign fund conducted a few years ago. That money will come from the sale of 34 acres of woodland owned by the parish between East End/Laurel Avenues and Drum Point Road. Potential buyers have come forward and we are working with the Diocesan Office of Planning and Construction to obtain the best possible price. In addition to addressing CAFRA (NJ Coastal Area Facility Review Act) requirements, Brick Township has indicated that we must demolish the old garage by the Rectory before approval of the sale can be considered, which has been completed this week, so I fully expect the sale to go forward, followed by announcement of preliminary plans for the new Center.

The full response from the parish and Diocese will be released very soon. Hopefully, it will explain exactly what is happening and why. I do not expect it to make people very happy (and, as someone who lives in the area that will be potentially affected by development, I will not claim that it makes *me* very happy either!) I do expect it to help people understand the reality and the necessity of this action to further the mission of Visitation Parish and the Church in Brick.

#### **LENTEN ACTIVITIES AT VISITATION**



Lent is not only about sacrifice. It is a time that provides us with opportunities to strengthen our prayer life and our commitment to be faithful servants of God. Here at Visitation, in addition to the year round devotions available, many activities are available at various times to meet a variety of schedules. Make this Lent a meaning one.

#### **DEVOTIONS**

Our prayers help us remember that we are totally dependent on God. In prayer we recognize and express the sovereign nature of our Creator. No Christian Prayer can occur without the action of the Holy Spirit. It is this action that unites the whole Church. The Church is a community. It expresses its nature as a community in its coming together in prayer.

Private prayer is good. But prayer as a community adds another dimension to the experience of prayer. Joined as a community, we experience the Body of Christ as

members of the Church. You may recall that as a Church we believe the Church is one, holy, catholic, and apostolic.

*Traditional Stations of the Cross* are available every Friday at 4:00 PM in the Church.

**Contemporary Stations of the Cross** are held on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 PM during Lent in the quiet of the Daily Chapel. They provide time for meditation as well as a dialog between Christ and each one of us. As we follow the stations, each meditation is an authentic application of Jesus' suffering to our personal lives. This is a wonderful opportunity to spend some time in the presence of God and experience the depth of the Lenten Season. The prayers used in this encounter help us connect Christ's last steps on this earth to our own daily lives.

**Living Stations of the Cross** will be held at 11:00 AM on Good Friday.

**Eucharistic Adoration** will take place immediately following the 7:30 AM daily Mass every weekday morning in the rectory chapel.

#### SOUP OF THE WEEK SOUTHWESTERNSOUP

into 1-inch pieces

and chopped

1 jalapeno pepper, seeded and 114-ounce can diced tomatoes

minced (optional)

2 cloves of garlic, minced

1 teaspoon chili powder
1 teaspoon ground cumin

In the bottom of a slow cooker, combine pork, onion, bell pepper, jalapeno, garlic, chili powder, cumin, salt, and pepper. Stir to combine.

Add broth, tomatoes, and beans; cover and cook on low for 6-8 hours or high for 3-4 hours.

When ready to serve, ladle soup into bowls and top with avocado and cilantro. Garnish soup with lime wedges. Serve with combread, if desired.

#### **LENT INSTRUCTIONS**

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead from Ash Wednesday, March 2nd until Holy Thursday, April 14th, the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert, alone, fasting and in intense prayer, beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:


- 1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below.
- 2. Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops).
- 3. All other Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE (no meat).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered serious. The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, March 5-6, 2022 to Trinity Sunday, June 12, 2022. However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.


