FROM THE DESK OF FR. SEÁN

Dear Parishioners,

Gaudete Sunday

It is the Third Sunday of Advent which is called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is Latin for “rejoice” and comes from Philippians 4:4-5: “Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.” This is the Introit, or entrance antiphon, for today's Mass and is also the first line of the second reading. Gaudete Sunday is a day for rejoicing as we draw near to the birth of Jesus, and it marks the midpoint of our Advent fast. The sacred ministers at the Mass don rose colored vestments today to denote this joyful anticipation we have that Christmas is near.

Reconciliation Monday

Confession will be offered in all parishes throughout the entire Archdiocese of New York and the Dioceses of Brooklyn and Rockville Centre tomorrow, Monday 15th December from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. and 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Making a good confession is the best way to enter into the spirit of the Advent season to prepare for the coming of the Lord at Christmas. St. Paul teaches us, “This saying is trustworthy and deserves full acceptance: Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners” (1 Tim 1:15). The very reason God sent his only Son to live among us, to suffer and die for us and to rise from the dead was so that he could save us from sin and death. No matter what sins you have committed, and no matter how many times or for how many months or even years you have committed them, God can forgive you, and he wants to do so more than you can possibly imagine. Make good use of the opportunity afforded you tomorrow on "Reconciliation Monday." The priest-confessor will be happy to give you any help you need in order to make a good confession and receive God's forgiveness. Even if you have no idea what to do or say, the priest is there to help you.

The Baltimore Catechism Teaches

A running series of questions and answers from the Baltimore Catechism to grow deeper in knowledge and love of God.

66. What is mortal sin?

Mortal sin is a grievous offense against the law of God. "Flee from sins as from the face of a serpent; for if thou comest near them, they will take hold of thee." (Ecclesiasticus 21:2)

67. Why is this sin called mortal?

This sin is called mortal, or deadly, because it deprives the sinner of sanctifying grace, the supernatural life of the soul. "Before man is life and death, good and evil; that which he shall choose shall be given him." (Ecclesiasticus 15:18)

69. What three things are necessary to make a sin mortal?

To make a sin mortal these three things are needed:

the thought, desire, word, action, or omission must be seriously wrong or considered seriously wrong;
the sinner, must be mindful of the serious wrong;
the sinner must fully consent to it.
