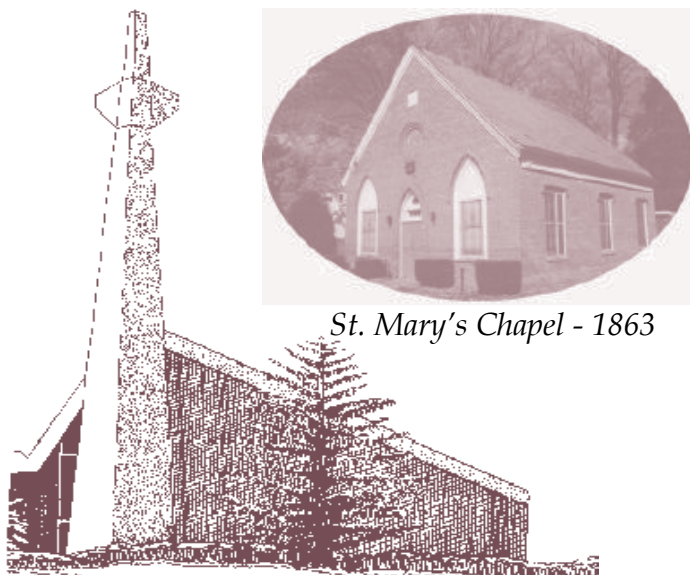

Lent is Almost Here...

LENT STARTS on ASH WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 22, 2023

Ash Wednesday is a day that offers a valuable opportunity to set a tone for the entire season. Lent is a liturgical season of conversion that focuses on prayer, fasting and almsgiving. During the 40 days of Lent, we are urged to reflect on our lives, perform acts of charity and make small sacrifices. Each pillar prepares us for the joyful celebration of Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday.

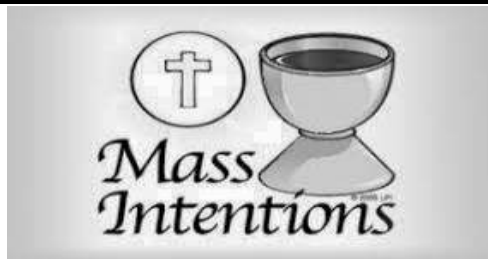
LENTEN FAST and ABSTINENCE

- Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 22, and ends on Holy Thursday, April 6.
- Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. This is a serious matter within Church law.
- Fasting means only one full meal a day may be taken. Two smaller meals may be eaten to maintain physical strength but together they should not equal another full meal in quantity. Snacking between meals is not permitted. Catholics ages 18-59 are obligated to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are not specifically obliged to fast are encouraged to join in the discipline of fasting to the extent that they are able.
- Abstinence forbids the eating of meat or poultry. Those who have reached the age of 14 and older are obligated to abstain on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Those who are not specifically obliged to abstain from eating meat are urged to join in the discipline of abstaining to the extent that they are able.
- All Fridays of the year are designated as days of penance during which we are encouraged to practice self-denial out of gratitude for the suffering and death Jesus accepted for us.
- Friday, March 17, is the solemnity of St. Patrick, the patron of the Archdiocese. Cardinal Dolan has granted a dispensation from the obligation to abstain from meat to all Roman Catholics. However, the faithful are urged to choose another day of penance during the week as part of the Lenten observances or to creatively make a gift to one of our food pantries or soup kitchens to ensure the poor will eat.

Reverence

For Christmas this year Cardinal Dolan gave all of the priests a book entitled *"Becoming Eucharistic People - The Hope and Promise of Parish Life"* by Timothy P. O'Malley. The book has some very beautiful insights about the Eucharistic revival the church is about to embark on.

One interesting reflection was on reverence. Webster's dictionary defines reverence as: "honor or respect felt or shown: deference especially profound adoring and awed respect, a gesture of respect (such as a bow), the state of being revered."

Remembering the sacredness of the place that we are entering into. Our church is different than the gym, school or playground. In fact, it is sacred ground and when we enter into the sacred, we should leave behind the secular world.

Lately I have been discovering in church that some of us may have forgotten the difference of where we are and enter church still carrying our coffee cups, assorted beverages and even sadly some breakfast. I have found these empty and sometimes not empty, discarded wrappings and cups under the pews. I assume the thought is that like at the movies or stadium, someone else will come and clean it. That someone at times ends up being me.

I am reminded that we are supposed to fast one hour prior to receiving Communion. Fasting means abstaining from food or drink (other than water). I bring this up so we all can remember the sacredness of where we are when we gather for Mass with each other. Let us continue to pray for each other and grow in our relationship with God.

RETURN LAST YEAR'S PALMS TO MAKE THIS YEAR'S ASHES

Where do the ashes that begin the Season of Lent come from? They come from the palm branches that were blessed and distributed during Palm Sunday last year. Because they are sacramentals, they must be disposed of in a proper way. Please bring back last year's palms and place them in the basket on the table at the rear of the Church by **Sunday, February 19**. Thank you.

2023 Cardinal's Appeal

The 2023 Cardinal's Appeal has begun! "*Blessed are all who take refuge in Him!*" (Psalm 2) In our Archdiocese, 2.8 million Catholics and countless of our non-Catholic brothers and sisters take refuge in the Lord through His Church and her ministries. The Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal exists to fund the expansive efforts of our Archdiocese to provide every person with an encounter with Jesus and a confidence that He, present in every church in the most Holy Eucharist, is our refuge.

The Cardinal's Appeal Archdiocesan goal is \$21 million. This gives \$9 million to assist financially vulnerable parishes; \$5 million for Charitable Outreach and Pastoral Support; \$4 million for Evangelization, Communications and Catholic Education; \$2 million to care for our retired priests and \$1 million for the formation of new parish priests.
