



THE EASTER TRIDUUM-BEGINS WITH THE EVENING MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER ON MAUNDAY THURSDAY, REACHING ITS HIGH POINT IN THE EASTER VIGIL, AND CLOSES WITH EVENING PRAYER ON EASTER SUNDAY, IT'S THE SUMMIT OF THE LITURGICAL YEAR. IT COMMEMORATES CHRIST'S PASCHAL MYSTERY, I.E., THE PASSION, DEATH, AND RESURRECTION OF JESUS.



## HOLY THURSDAY (We remember) APRIL 1

"Solemn Celebration of the Lord's Supper" 7:00 p.m. Commemorates the day Jesus instituted the Eucharist, the Sacred Priesthood and the call to service by the washing of feet.

# GOOD FRIDAY (We celebrate) APRIL 2

"Stations of the Cross" 3:00 p.m.

Recreates the scenes to and on Calvary, we are called to walk with Jesus along the Via Crucis.

"Solemn Celebration of the Lord's Passion" 7:00 p.m. Commemorates the execution of Jesus on the Cross.

# HOLY SATURDAY (We believe) APRIL 3

"Solemn Vigil of Easter" 8:30 pm
Commemorates the emergence of Jesus from the tomb. We are called to witness the Triumphant Jesus returning to life.



#### FIRST READING

Parents whose children are afraid of the dark are struck by John's observation that darkness is preferred to light. Perhaps this is as it should be. God made us to live in the light of his love. But this original friendship with God was corrupted by sin. Our sin causes us to shy away from Christ, the light that has come into the world. During the season of Lent, we try to fight this tendency by remembering God's great mercy and the salvation that we have received through Jesus. We do not fear confessing our sins. knowing that God forgives us, and so, during Lent, we seek out opportunities to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

After your family gathers, sit for a time in darkness, then light a candle. Invite people to talk about what it felt like to be in the darkness and to compare that to their feelings when the candle was lit. What are we able to see by the limited glow of the candlelight that we couldn't see when we were sitting in darkness? Read today's Gospel, John 3:14-21. John's Gospel teaches us that Jesus was the light that came into the world. In this light we know ourselves to be sinners, but we are not condemned. Instead we have been saved because we have been forgiven through Jesus' sacrifice on the cross. Conclude in prayer together, thanking God for the great gift of forgiveness we have received through Jesus. Pray together the Act of Contrition.





Wouldn't it be amazing to be face to face with Jesus? Imagine sitting with Him, talking together, thanking Him for His gifts, asking for favors. In many churches throughout the world, Catholics are able to do just that in Perpetual Adoration. Adoration is a Eucharistic devotion that offers the opportunity to be in the presence of Jesus, under the appearance of the Eucharistic Host – the Blessed Sacrament. Placed in a monstrance for display, all can see and pray in the presence of Our Lord. Parishes with Perpetual Adoration chapels are able to host adoration twenty-four hours a day. Other parishes offer periods of time adorers can worship in person. "Adoration is the rst attitude of man acknowledging that he is a creature before his Creator. It exalts the greatness of the Lord who made us and the almighty power of the Savior who sets us free from evil" (CCC, #2628). There are many ways to adore God, but in Adoration, we are truly in Jesus' presence adoring him in person.




