Jesus' instructions on how to be ready for the coming judgment continue in the stories and sayings found in today's Gospel. We are not to be like the greedy rich man in last Sunday's Gospel who planned to store his great harvest in barns rather than share it. We are, rather, to share our wealth with those in need. The antidote for the anxiety brought on by the coming judgment is to relinquish our possessions and provide for the needs of others. Our treasure will be in heaven where it will not wear out or be destroyed.

The other major way to be ready for the coming judgment is to be watchful. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus tells a parable about watchfulness to begin making this point. We must be like servants waiting for the master's return from a wedding banquet, which, even now, can last for a few days in the Middle East. We must be watchful so that even if the master comes after midnight, we will be ready for him. This is what the coming of the Son of Man will be like.

Peter asks if this parable is meant for the apostles or for the large crowd that has gathered to listen to Jesus. Without answering Peter's question, Jesus responds with another parable about servants awaiting the return of their master. It begins with a question: "Who, then, is the faithful and prudent steward whom the master will put in charge of his servants to distribute the food allowance at the proper time?" This parable adds to the theme of watchfulness; it explains how to wait and reminds us of the reward for the faithful follower at the heavenly banquet after the judgment. If it is addressed to the apostles, then it could also be addressed to leadership in the early Church. Either way, the parables reminds us that we should be found doing our jobs when the master arrives. If we are doing our jobs, our reward will be great. But if we relax, neglect our duties, and begin to act like the greedy rich man—eating, drinking, and making merry—we will not have a place in the kingdom. Watchfulness means living in such a consistently moral and obedient way that we are always ready to give an account to God of how we have lived.



My Body Is Hers, His Body Is Ours

My wife's stroke brought home to me our "one-flesh" union – and the union between Christ and the Church

WHEN I CAME HOME from work Dec. 21, 2021, my wife, April, was in bed. She had been sick for a while, but her voice sounded unusually weak as she called out to me to hand her a tissue.

That was strange. The tissues were less than an arm's reach away.

That's when my marriage prep training kicked in. My wife and I have been teaching marriage preparation classes for years, and one of the lessons is about the "one-flesh union" between spouses in the sacrament of matrimony.

"One-flesh union means you have to do things for each other," I tell couples. "If she wants the ketchup, don't tell her, 'You have two legs. Get the ketchup yourself!' No. She also has your two legs. Get the ketchup for her."

So I fought the urge to say, "Reach it yourself!" and got her the tissue. Then she asked me to help her out of bed. I did. And that's when I realized her left side was completely paralyzed. She crumpled to the floor. I called an ambulance. She had suffered a massive stroke.

In the months since, I have learned the meaning of "one-flesh union" more than I ever had before.

"Husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies," St. Paul wrote to the Ephesians. "He who loves his wife loves himself" (Eph 5:28).

Women already know how connected their bodies are to ours: Their bodies go through an ordeal to make us fathers. But I had to learn to offer my body back, fast. My wife has spent months in recovery. She has her speech back, mostly. She can walk, but tires quickly. And she doesn't have much use of her left hand or arm. I help her dress, make her meals and keep her and the children on schedule.

These days, it isn't hard to see how our union is meant to reflect the relationship between Christ and his bride, the Church.

"No man ever hates his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, as Christ does the Church, because we are members of his body," St. Paul wrote. "This is a great mystery, but I speak in reference to Christ and the Church" (Eph 5:29-30; 32).

A married couple is a close partnership in which spouses do things for one another such that, together, they act as one. Women make men fathers, men make women mothers, and together they make a family home.

Christ and his Church, likewise, form a close partnership and together they act as one. The Church, the bride of Christ, is our spiritual mother and makes priests spiritual fathers. As we have children and nourish them, the priest baptizes them and gives them holy Communion. We are each integral to the Church's work, and therefore integral to Christ's mission.

In addition to marriage preparation, my wife and I teach confirmation classes, and every year I tell the students how important this sacrament is because it makes them grown-ups in the Church. What does a mature Christian do? What are we called to do as Knights? Go to Mass, where Jesus comes to you, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, and then

walk out of the church into the world. Jesus in the host can't speak, he can't walk, and he can't reach out with his arms. He relies on us to speak for him, walk for him, and reach others for him.

In other words, in his real presence in the Eucharist, Jesus wants the same kind of "one-flesh union" with the Church that I have with my wife, April — only he loves me more than I love her, and I need him more than she needs me.

My job, I now know, is to be in the habit of doing for Christ what I do for April — whatever he wants, whenever he asks.

Mi Cuerpo es de Ella, Su Cuerpo es Nuestro

El derrame cerebral de mi esposa me hizo comprender nuestra unión de “una sola carne” y la unión entre Cristo y la Iglesia. By Tom Hoopes

CUANDO LLEGUE A CASA del trabajo el 21 de diciembre del 2021, mi esposa, Abril, estaba en cama. Había estado enferma por algún tiempo, pero su voz se escuchaba inusualmente débil al pedirme un pañuelo.

Se me hizo raro. Ya que los pañuelos estaban al alcance de su mano.

Es justo cuando mi preparación prematrimonial se me vino a la mente. Mi esposa y yo habíamos estado ofreciendo clases prematrimoniales por varios años, y una de las lecciones es acerca de “la unión como una sola carne” entre esposos en el sacramento del matrimonio.

Les digo a las parejas que “la unión de una sola carne significa que se necesita hacer cosas el uno por el otro”. “Si ella necesita el cátsup, no le digas “tu tienes dos pies. ¡Agarra el cátsup tu!” No. Ella también tiene tus pies. Pásale el cátsup.”

Así que luché contra mi impulso de decir: “Agárralo tú! Y le pasé un pañuelo. Y luego me pidió ayuda para bajar de la cama. Y le ayude. Y es cuando me di cuenta de que su lado izquierdo estaba completamente paralizado. Se derrumbó al suelo. Llame a la ambulancia. Había sufrido un derrame cerebral masivo.

En los meses desde entonces, he aprendido el significado de “un-solo cuerpo”.

San Pablo escribió a los Efesios. “Del mismo modo, los maridos deben amar a su mujer como a su propio cuerpo. El que ama a su esposa se ama a sí mismo (Efesios 5:28).”

Las mujeres ya saben la conexión que tiene sus cuerpos a los nuestro: Sus cuerpos pasan por mucho para hacernos padres. Pero yo tuve que aprender a ofrecer mi cuerpo también, y bastante rápido. Mi esposa ha estado en recuperación por varios meses. Ya casi recupera por completo su habla. Puede caminar, pero se cansa rápidamente. Y casi no tiene movimiento en su mano y brazo izquierdo. Le ayudo vestirse, a hacerle su comida y mantengo los calendarios de ella y nuestros hijos al corriente.

En estos días, no ha sido difícil ver como nuestra unión es reflejo de la relación entre Cristo y su esposa, la iglesia.

San Pablo escribió “Nadie menosprecia a su propio cuerpo, sino que lo alimenta y lo cuida. Así hace Cristo por la Iglesia, por nosotros, que somos los miembros de su Cuerpo. Este es un gran misterio: y yo digo que se refiere a Cristo y a la Iglesia. (Efesios 5:29-30;32).

Una pareja casada es una sociedad estrecha en la que los cónyuges hacen cosas el uno por el otro de tal manera que, juntos, actúan como uno solo. Las mujeres hacen a los hombres padres, los hombres a las mujeres madres, y juntos hacen un hogar familiar.

Cristo y su Iglesia, de igual manera forman una asociación juntos actúan como uno solo. La Iglesia, la esposa de Cristo, es nuestra madre espiritual y hace a los sacerdotes padres espirituales. Conforme tenemos hijos y los alimentamos, el sacerdote los bautiza y les da la sagrada Comunión. Cada uno de nosotros somos parte integral del trabajo de la Iglesia y, por lo tanto, parte integral de la misión de Cristo.

Además de las clases prematrimoniales, yo y mi esposa enseñamos clases de confirmación, y cada año le digo a mis estudiantes que este sacramento es de suma importancia porque los hace “adultos” en la Iglesia. ¿Qué hace un cristiano maduro? ¿A que somos llamados como Caballeros? Ve a Misa, donde Jesús viene a ti, verdaderamente presente en el Santísimo Sacramento, y luego sal de la iglesia al mundo. Jesús en la ostia no puede hablar, ni caminar, y

no puede alcanzar con sus brazos. El confía en nosotros para hablar por él, caminar por él, y alcanzar a otros por él.

En otras palabras, en su presencia real en la Eucaristía, Jesús quiere la misma unión de “un solo cuerpo” con la Iglesia que yo tengo con mi esposa, Abril-la única diferencia es que el me ama más que yo la amo a ella, y yo lo necesito más que ella me necesita.

Mi trabajo, lo se ahora, es tener el hábito de hacer por Cristo lo que hago por Abril- lo que él quiera, cuando el pida.





Aug. 2 - St. Peter Julian Eymard (1868). Born in France, Peter was ordained in 1834 and earned a reputation as a preacher. He was friends with St. John Vianney. He founded the Congregation of the Priests of the Blessed Sacrament to increase devotion to the Holy Eucharist.



Aug. 9 - St. Edith Stein (1942). Born Jewish, she was a brilliant atheist intellectual in Germany. Edith converted to Catholicism after studying St. Teresa of Avila, and became a Carmelite nun. Although her order tied to shelter her from the Nazis, she was arrested and executed at Auschwitz.

Aug. 15 - Solemnity of the Assumption. Declared a dogma of faith in 1950 by Pope Pius XII, the Assumption celebrates Mary's being taken up into Heaven body and soul at the end of her life.



Aug. 24 - St. Bartholomew the Apostle (1st Century). Bartholomew is thought by some scholars to be the apostle, Nathanael (John 1:46). After Jesus's Ascension, Nathanael spread Christianity to India and Armenia, where he was martyred.






