THE FIRST LABOR DAY CELEBRATION WAS SEPT. 5, 1882 IN NEW YORK CITY On that Tuesday, 10,000 citizens marched for labor rights down the streets of Manhattan. During this time the average American worked 12 hours a day, six days a week. It wasn't until the Adamson Act passed on September 3, 1916 that our modern 8 hour work day was established.
