In our first reading, this weekend, the Israelites grumble against God and Moses for taking them out into the desert. I wonder how often we are tempted to blame God for the ills of the world and our lives. Even hurricanes and tornadoes are considered "acts of God" by insurance companies. God seems to get blamed for a lot of things. I suppose God can handle it from His end but establishing it as a pattern or habit on our end can be dangerous to our faith. And let's be real: we do it a lot. Death? God's fault or God's will. Terminal Illness? How can God do this to me? Didn't win the lotto? Must be God's fault. The truth is we need someone to blame. It's a part of what we call Original Sin. Adam and Eve are in the garden after they have eaten of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. God finds out what they have done. God asks Adam to take responsibility for what he

has done and he blames Eve. God asks Eve to take responsibility and she blames the snake. When will we take responsibility for our own lives and our relationship with God. If we are no longer children, it is called maturity in our nature and maturity in our faith. Can we recognize that we are lucky to be alive by the grace of creation. Can we see that we have a new way of living in peace and security even amid trial and suffering by the grace of our redemption in Christ and sanctification in the Holy Spirit? Or do we need to be wrapped up in some sort of self-justification for every ounce of pain and heartache we experience. I am certain that we all know someone who left the faith because they blame God for something that has befallen them in life. Don't let happen to you! Be firm and stouthearted in faith. Develop a strong character of hope and trust in God as our Lord possessed in the Garden of Gethsemane and throughout his trial and execution. It can only come through prayer and the recognition that we are indebted to God; God is not indebted to us.
