

FROM OUR PASTOR—we opened officially for Masses on the Feast of Corpus Christi with our regular Mass schedule. It was wonderful to "officially" open and see people again. The rules remain in place so that we can have only 100-125 people in the church, everyone must wear a mask, social/physical distancing must be maintained, and Communion will be distributed at the end of Mass as people leave.

There are blue tape marks on the pews that people must sit on in order to maintain the correct distancing. All in all, it worked very well, and I was pleased. I continue to suggest that those who are able to attend daily Mass do so and leave the Sunday Masses for those unable to attend during the week.

Please be aware that the obligation is lifted for anyone older, with a health risk, or just nervous about attending Mass at this time.
