

ST. BENEDICT OF NURSIA

St. Benedict of Nursia lived sixty-seven years, dying on March 21st around 547 AD. Frustrated with the corruption of the world and its influence on the life of the Church, Benedict sought peace, prayer and Christian community in the mountains outside Rome, likely at Monte Casino, founding monasticism as we know it and where the abbot drew up a rule of life, the famous "Rule of St. Benedict," which emphasized prayer, work, simplicity, and hospitality. Though known as a rule for monks, it is addressed to all those who seek "to do battle for Christ the Lord, the true King."

He was particularly known for having just the right words or prayers to help his spiritual sons and daughters grow in holiness. Saint Benedict's quiet and loving decision to build communities of work, prayer and peace upon the teachings of Christ worked miracles among his followers, renewed the Church, and transformed the world.
