28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

“In every circumstance and in all things I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry, of living in abundance and of being in need.” (Philippians 4:13) Can you remember an instance in which you made someone’s eyes light up with joy? Perhaps, it was you who were inspired by another’s gift: a book, a scene from a movie, a shared experience. To be able to draw hope from something is a beautiful gift – something that we are all capable of doing. I once had the opportunity to gift a Hebrew Bible to a Jewish man in a homeless shelter. It changed his life insofar as the limited time I was blessed to experience it. It’s the simple things in life that can bring so much joy. But in our culture of “wanting more” the next thing is never enough. We see it with celebrities all the time. Individuals who are supposedly blessed with talent, physical beauty, wealth, and the promise of a happy life end up struggling with drugs, alcohol, and other addictions beyond imagination. Doesn’t money bring happiness? I think it can to an extent, but the key is a spirit of detachment. A friend of mine has a great job, a beautiful house, nine children, and a supportive marriage. Before moving from one large house to an even larger one to accommodate his growing family, he asked his spiritual director whether it was too much of an extravagance to purchase the new mansion. He was asked whether he was overly attached to his worldly goods. The honest answer was “no” and so it was approved. The lesson is that it’s not what you have so much as why you have it. And if you are you are not overly attached to any material good, such that it drives a wedge between you and God, who is the true giver of every good gift, then enjoy. But recognize that *“abundance does not yield either knowledge or virtue. How so? Because just as penury occasions much wrongdoing, so does plenty. Many who have become affluent have become derelict. They do not know how to bear their good fortune. But not so with Paul, for what he received he spent on others. He emptied himself for others.”* [St. Augustine of Hippo, Homily on Philippians] **We must be inclined to see how true wealth comes from God in the form of Fruits of the Holy Spirit, Virtue, and a good conscience. Everything else is secondary. Do not allow our materialistic culture to program your mind otherwise.**

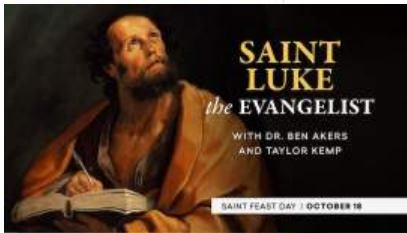

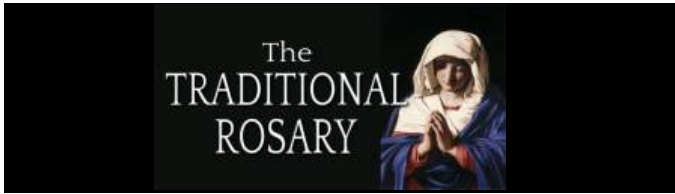

Month of the Most Holy Rosary THE TRADITIONAL CATHOLIC ROSARY

October is dedicated as the Month of the Rosary because we celebrate the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary each year on October 7.
