30TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today, Jesus calls us to reflect on the spiritual ownership which God places on all humanity to varying degrees: by Creation, Redemption, and Sanctification. You may not be comfortable with the notion that God claims ownership over you. There is a saying: "Your life is not your own." All humanity and the rest of created matter owes their beginning to God: the Prime Mover. Within the Christian framework, we are children of God: not slaves, but family. Our Baptism and Confirmation welcome us deeply into this family by making us sharers in the Redemption Jesus Christ won for us. The sacramental gifts bestowed on humanity in these two important events create an inscription or seal on our souls - an imprint of Jesus' Being and saving works - carved into the very fabric of who we are as Christians. Further, the other sacraments work to Sanctify our lives as we make our way in the world: Penance, Eucharist, Holy Orders, Marriage. God offers us the opportunity to be linked closely to Him. Some people may see this as a hindrance against freedom. Mature Christians view this as the expansion of our freedom to love and to be loved.

THE 13th DAY

In a world torn apart by persecution, war, and oppression, three children in Fatima, Portugal, were chosen by God to

offer an urgent message of hope to the world. Based on the memoirs of the oldest seer, Lucia Santos, and many thousands of independent eye-witness accounts, The 13th Day dramatizes the true story of three young shepherds who experienced six apparitions of Our Lady between May and October 1917, which culminated in the final prophesied Miracle of the Sun on October 13.

SEVEN SISTERS APOSTOLATE

The mission of the Seven Sisters Apostolate is a call to strengthen the Church by ensuring that a Holy Hour is prayed each day of the week for the sole intention of a specific priest - a "holy wasting" (Mt. 26:10) - or lavishing of prayer for his deeper conformity to Christ. Here is how it's structured: *Seven Women*: at least seven (7) women are needed to respond to the mission of the Apostolate; *One Priest*: Fr. Kevin Malick, Parish pastor, will be the recipient of the prayers



prayers; *One Hour, One Day*: each member will commit to a Holy Hour on a distinct day of the week thus covering a complete week. The Seven Sister may pray at any time on her day; Holy Eucharist: ideally, the Holy Hour is prayed in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament -either in an Adoration Chapel or in front of a Tabernacle; *One Year*: the generous commitment of one hour per week of prayer is asked for a period of one (1) year.
