FR. KEVIN'S REFLECTION

32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Thus will I bless you while I live; lifting up my hands, I will call upon your name. As with the riches of a banquet shall my soul be satisfied, and with exultant lips my mouth shall praise you. I will remember you upon my couch, and through the night-watches I will meditate on you: You are my help, and in the shadow of your wings I shout for joy." (Ps63:5-9)

Our Responsorial Psalm this weekend bids us ask if we truly long for God, which is the sign of Christian maturity. When we are children, our parents give us everything we consider in life – this includes the foundations for faith. If those foundations are weak, Christian maturity will be harder to discern. Regardless of what underpinnings for faith in God we are given, each of us reach a point when we begin to reject the authority of our parents (usually as teens) and begin to discern for ourselves that which will form our rule of life. This discernment includes whether God will be a part of it. In the Judeo-Christian worldview, we were created by God to love God. This is our beginning, and this is our end. Amidst this life, we are driven to seek our fulfillment in our relationship with God through prayer.

Pure prayer such as is worthy of God, O disciple of God, is not uttered by means of compound words. Prayer that is worthy of God consists in this: that one gather in one's mind from the entire world and not let it be secretly bound to anything; that one place it entirely at God's disposal and forget, during the time of prayer, everything that is material, including one's own self and the place where one is standing. One should be secretly swallowed up in the spirit of God, and one should clothe oneself in God at the time of prayer both outwardly and inwardly, set on fire with ardent love for him and entirely engulfed in his thoughts of God, entirely commingled in all of him, with the movements of one's thoughts suffused with wondrous recollection of God, while the soul has gone out in love to seek him whom it loves, just as David said, "My soul has gone out after you." [PHILOXENUS OF MABBUG EXCERPT ON PRAYER]

Our Psalm reminds us that true pray reaches out to God, our fulfillment in this life and our end in eternity, and the experience of such is not just for the monks, but for each of us who desire that relationship and put it into practice.

MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR DESMOND

Thank you for your prayerful thoughts and birthday wishes. I appreciate them. Doing very well and fitting into the schedule easily. Only 11 monks here now, many are very old. Very different from when I was here in 2013. As a result, those that are able have a lot to do in the house and gardens. However both morning and afternoon work periods have been shortened by a half an hour and now we begin the day at 4:30am instead of 3:30am. The fast is also lightened so I shouldn't lose 50 pounds in 4 months like last time. Because of the needs in the house and gardens, the casket factory is all run now by lay staff.

The retreat house has been very busy. My first week here the 18 Deacons being ordained by the Archdiocese of Dubuque this year had a full week retreat. Serra Club and others came the rest of the time which means there's always at least 20 in the retreat house. Also, it was great to see we had a one day high school retreat -these stopped during COVID. We have free time from 2-5:30pm on Sundays so I did a 20 mile bike ride -there are some hills here! But I did stop and got chocolate ice cream for my birthday. You are in my thoughts and prayers. Especially praying for those to be confirmed. God bless, Msgr. Desmond
