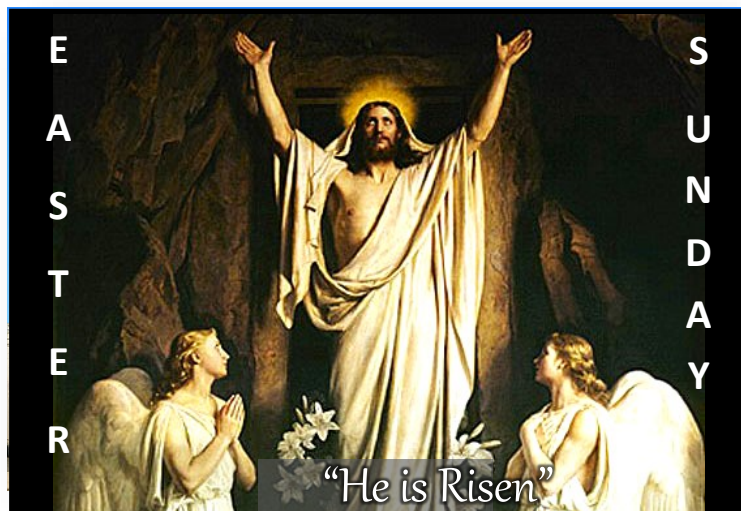

It reminds us of God's presence here and now.


