FROM THE Pastor...



"Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" (Mark 4) If God is love, then why does He allow us to suffer so? Perhaps our suffering is a matter of our own design. What we call Original Sin is the manifestation of sin, suffering, and death that is the result of human decision making. Adam and Eve chose to eat the apple and sever their relationship from God. Before their decision, they lived freely in virtue, peace, and without care, but still they wanted more. Rarely are we content with what we have. Our Gospel today conveys the Providence of God's love for us. Even amidst the storms of life, His love for us is in control. I ask myself: Why do I want more than this certitude? Why do I reject God's love outright because it does not fit into the picture of love as I see it should be? Our sin corrupts our vision of God's love. Suffering stifles our experience of the relationship He desires with us. Death is viewed as a punishment of our human weakness. I think this is why I struggle to love myself and others as I know God loves me. I feel broken in prayer. At times, I want to give up. But then I realize the problem is with me, NOT God. The Apostles feared perishing from the storm while our Lord slept in peace. Their fear was their own. Jesus woke up at their pleas and stilled the storm as if their fear of death considering the faith they lacked, could be likened to a child's tears making too much out of a superficial scrape. Our scrapes may be complicated and deeper, but we tend to place the blame on a lack of God's love when the fault rests on our broken humanity. How in so much brokenness am I supposed to love God for God's own sake (true love is to seek another's happiness, in this case God's own happiness) if I cannot even love myself as I should? There is no academic answer to this conundrum. Rather, it is experiential. If we spend enough time recognizing an objective reality: God loves us despite our brokenness. This truth begins to seep in through the cracks of even the strongest psychological defense mechanisms we have constructed of our false self (how we wish we were) and is replaced by the beauty of how God sees us. The heart of the matter lies in the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Jesus. He did not return to His disciples who had fled Him with vengeance, but compassion and forgiveness. God's love builds; it does not tear down. We do enough of that ourselves (even as others do it to us). We need to learn to love ourselves as did the Apostles, as God loves us. Only then, will we truly be free to trust in the care and protection of a loving Father amid life's storms.
