FROM THE Pastor...



"He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick - no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic" (Mark 6:8ff). Discipleship requires discipline, but not pain. The world often misinterprets true Christian zeal with the suffering that may result from the rejection of materialism. Jesus' instructions to His disciples were specific – they were to rely on others' kindness and generosity for survival. A walking stick for obvious reasons and sandals to keep them on mission without unnecessary struggle. In the summer before my diaconate ordination, the year before I was ordained a priest, I went on a 35-day Ignatian Retreat to perform the complete Spiritual Exercises of Saint Ignatius Loyola. One of the recommendations (but not requirements) was to walk around outside barefoot to accompany an exercise on the pains of Hell. I took it too far! I walked a mile up the gravel driveway with great enthusiasm that was lessening with every step. By the time I turned around, my soft soles were sore and ready to bleed. And that they did by the time I arrived at my room. How I should have remembered our Lord's command to wear sandals! My retreat director scolded me for falling into what could be a sin of spiritual pride resulting in the detriment of the body. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are all excellent disciplines to help us focus our attention away from the self and towards God – but never should we allow zeal, which is usually immature and selfish, to deprive of peace. How many saints, in their journals have mourned the detriment of damaging their bodies (particularly in their youth) because of an immature outlook on our relationship with God. We must have a balanced, joyful outlook on the practice when it is engaged. Medieval monasticism had a practice of self-scourging or flogging as a means of penance to the point of drawing out blood. What is the point of that? Suffering for its own sake and drawing pain from the body for the reparation of sin has long been outlawed by the Church, except under the careful direction of an expert spiritual director (most directors refuse the practice unless dealing with a spiritually advanced client of sound heart and mind). For the rest of us, the stresses of life and daily dangers of temptations to sin are enough for a day's labor. Therefore, be disciplined, but not overzealous. The wise individual knows that steady is the course because narrow is the road.
