“He said to them, ‘Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while.’” (Mark 6:31) Even God rested on the 7th day in the first creation story. Rest is an important part of life. It is essential to our livelihood.

A few weeks ago, my doctor was worried about my blood pressure and ordered me get a digital blood pressure cuff, which I was hesitant to do. The cuff records information, which is then stored, compiled, and delivered to my doctor as she requests it. It turns out that my blood pressure is currently fine, but she wants me to keep an eye on it as I am prone to stress that can compound health effects on my bodily fitness and mental acuity. Stress, I am reminded, is a very powerful factor in our lives and how we deal with or ignore, is essential to recognize.

I recall in my travels to European countries my experience of many privately-owned businesses shutting down in the middle of the day for siesta – a time for rest: perhaps a walk or a nap or just time to run some personal errands to lighten the overall load of the workday. Time spent in prayer, too, and meditation throughout the day is key to reminding ourselves that we are not our work.

Jesus insists to his disciples that they spend time away from ministry to care for themselves and nourish their relationship with Him and their Father in heaven. Do we do this? Often, I try to get up early and pray before daily work begins, and before time runs short and tiredness sets in. Whatever our schedule, be sure to include some time for yourself – for rest, exercise, and prayer so that our Lord may use us as effective instruments in the world.
