From the Pastor



Would you rather be loved or feared? Most people would say that it depends upon the situation. The Bible often seems to be split by the proper characterization of God. Is He to be loved by humanity, feared by humanity, or perhaps both? Many figures in the Old Testament present the teaching of Law which is to be obeyed without exception, and yet Jesus and Saint Paul emphasize the importance of the Law laying a *foundation* for behavior but is not the culmination of our experience of God: that lies in our *relationship* with our heavenly Father. We may have been led to believe at different times in our life that we can earn God's love by the way we behave (Law). But doesn't Jesus remind us that God loves us regardless of the way we behave? Certainly, morality is important, but it is not everything. We cannot know how to love until we have the experience of *being* loved. The experience of being loved provides the motivation for wanting to please the lover. We must understand the nature of our relationship with God. He loves us unconditionally. We know we are loved regardless of our behavior. The happy sinner with then say: "Well then, I shall behave as I wish for God loves me anyway." The sorrowful sinner, recognizing the grief we cause God will try to mend their ways in the future. The happy sinner has no relationship with God and spurns His love. Our discipleship to Jesus Christ and our relationship with the Father requires not moral perfection, for that is impossible, but rather to deepen our relationship with God who is perfect through repentance for our sins.

DOROTHY DAY AND THE CATHOLIC WORKER MOVEMENT

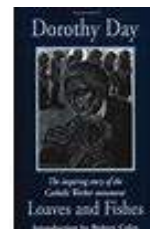


Servant of God Dorothy Day (Nov. 8, 1897 – November 29, 1980) was an American journalist turned social activist who converted and, along with Peter Maurin, founded the Catholic Worker

Movement. “She became known for her social justice campaigns in defense of the poor, forsaken, hungry and homeless. She remained faithful to the Gospel and the church” while “immersed in the social issues of the day, with the aim of transforming both individuals and society. In an age marked by widespread violence, impersonal government, shallow interpersonal commitments, and a quest for self-fulfillment, Dorothy’s spirit fosters nonviolence, personal responsibility of all people to the poorest ones among us, and fidelity to community and to God.”

In her 1963 book *Loaves and Fishes: The Inspiring Story of the Catholic Worker Movement*, Dorothy writes, “It seems to me that in the future the family - the ideal family – will always try to care for one more. If every family that professed to follow Scriptural teaching, whether Jew, Protestant, or Catholic, were to do this, there would be no need for huge institutions, houses of dead storage where human beings waste away in loneliness and despair...”



Dorothy was named a Servant of God in 2000, following the petition of then Archbishop of New York Cardinal John O’Connor. The cause for her canonization is being pursued by the Dorothy Day Guild. For more information, go to dorothydayguild.org.

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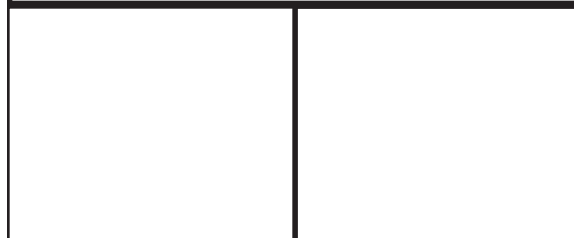

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
