FROM THE Pastor...



"Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said to him, "You are lacking in one thing. Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." At that statement his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions." (Mark 10) Jesus loved him. In other words, Jesus wanted what was best for him. Jesus recognized that the soul feeds the body much more than the body feeds the soul. Certainly, the body can care for the soul: through proper study, nutrition, and exercise the mind can function clearly and respond better to stress. But, the body through sin and neglect can also impede the soul's proper functions. Jesus loves us body and soul, while knowing that the health and life of the soul are of utmost importance. The body is created by our parents. We understand that God creates the soul as cell division begins soon after conception and the human, small as it is, begins to grow and take life upon itself. We belong to God and like a rental car want to return it in fine working order. There was a disturbing trend some time ago in which persons would rent a car, taking full insurance on it and then use the car for street racing, returning it to the dealership a wreck. Many people believe God is an insurance policy that can be trampled upon in this life because of his great love and mercy and so even if we return to him a wreck, He will just freely take us back. Jesus reminds us that a loving relationship requires constant reciprocity between two beings and the things of this world can only temporarily satisfy us, but cannot provide a relationship with the great Other, only ourselves. That is the chief problem with striving to attain material possessions – they limit our experience of relationship to the self. Sociologically speaking, to be human (and thus be satisfied with life) we must be in a relationship with others. We often compare our self-worth to the possessions we attain. God looks at us differently. We should strive to see ourselves as God sees us. This is the definition of theological wisdom. Pray to attain wisdom so that we may recognize what, in the world, is of true value and leads to the happiness and satisfaction that we seek.

Why Catholics should **VOTE NO TO THE ERA?**

On November 5th, New Yorkers will vote on **Proposal One** or the "Equal Rights Amendment (ERA)," a vaguely worded, unnecessary, and dangerous NYS Constitutional Amendment that would give New York State more authority than parents in making important medical decisions for children, and remove common sense protections for children.



What exactly would the ERA do?

1. **Enshrine abortion up until birth in the New York State Constitution**, making limitations to protect women and children impossible to pass.
2. **Threaten conscience protections** for health care professionals and individuals.
3. **Allow children to make life-altering medical decisions without parental consent**, including gender reassignment therapies and surgeries.
4. **Loosen common-sense, age-appropriate restrictions** on "sexual freedom" and the potential "right to die."

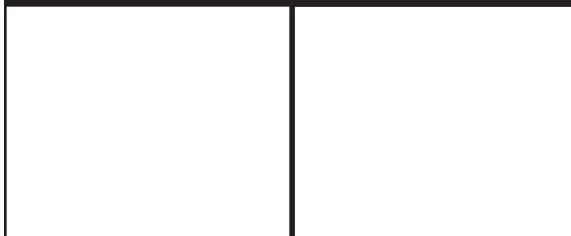
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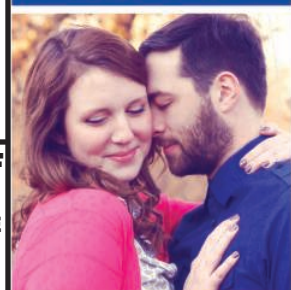
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
