## FROM THE Pastor...



"Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." (Mark 12) She contributed her whole livelihood. Growing up in the city, I was raised to be curious about what happened to monies given to the poor. Would they use it for food and housing, or drugs and alcohol? Such criticism of others who have nothing, does nothing for anyone. Last year, during the cold winter, a homeless individual begged me for something to keep him warm. I immediately gave him an extra coat. It wasn't cheap, but it was an extra coat that I didn't need. It was red. A few days later, I saw the same individual walking the streets of Uptown Kingston with a black coat. Did he sell the one I gave him and beg for another? Thoughts raced through my mind: anger and regret for my kindness. It was a nice coat that I could still be wearing. It struck me later that I was being selfish in my assessment of the situation. Did he give the coat to someone who needed it more than he: perhaps not, but perhaps so. There is a famous saying in Alcoholics Anonymous: "Take care of your side of the street." You may be right. You may be wrong about what other people do with your generosity. **It must not get in the way of your helping others.** That which was special about the poor woman in today's Gospel was her disposition to help others who had less than she had: end of story. This is the fundamental quality of Catholic Social Teaching. If you have two coats, one **belongs** to the individual who has less than you do. We might think it a nice gesture to give an extra coat to another, but really, according to the law of the Gospel, that coat belongs to them and it is in all justice that you give it to them. A tough lesson indeed, but one designed to protect "your side of the street" and your relationship with God.

**From Msgr. Desmond O'Connor to the parishioners of St. Joseph:**

Please be assured that all the parishioners of St. Joseph are in my prayers. When I retired last year it was my desire to be a long term guest at New Melleray Trappist Monastery in Dubuque, Iowa. It was also arranged that as a long term guest I would visit my family every April and November. However, situations changed and I am now home in Greene County for good. Three things occurred that brought about this change.

First, New Melleray was listed in 'serious jeopardy' by the Abbott General in Rome. This was due to the age and declining health of the 10 monks still there. One 93, 5 in their upper 80's, 3 in their 70's, and one 42. A priest was sent by the Abbott General in Rome to determine the future of the house, and things look bleak.

Second, I developed some health issues other than my eyes that need ongoing appointments near home where my insurance covers.

Third, I was truly moved by a book I read on Edith Stein which pointed out that she wanted to live a semi secluded life close to the Eucharist, Scriptures, Silence and praying for those suffering from the Holocaust. This included not only family and fellow Jews, but the German public and even Hitler and Himmler. I must say I was praying every day for the victims of abuse that I had met with and their families. After reading this book I also was able to pray for the abusers. It then struck me that I could be close to the Eucharist, Scripture, Silence and pray for those affected by abuse while at my house. This also allows me to be close to the doctors and my family. So I intend to live a semi-hermetical life at home. Health issues will determine how this develops.

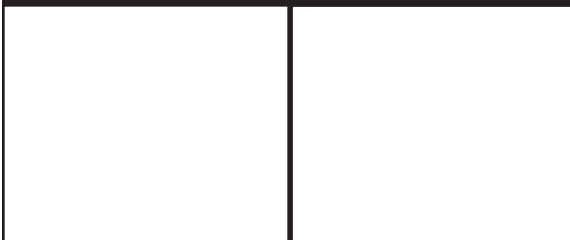
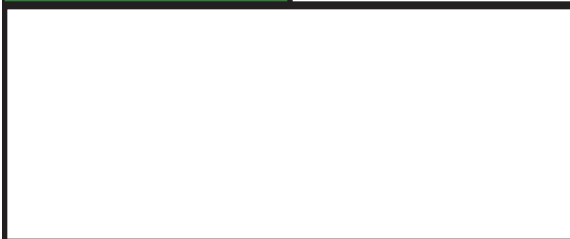

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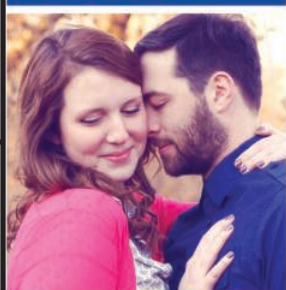
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
