Deacon Bob's Reflection... Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

The actual title of this Sunday is Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. These used to be two separate Sundays, Passion Sunday on the 5th Sunday of Lent, and Palm Sunday on the 6th Sunday of Lent, starting Holy Week. Vatican II combined them, as in the early and

The focus is on the Passion of the Lord, the Gospel, but both readings point to the events of today's Gospel. The reading from Isaiah is from the Servant Song part of Isaiah, written about 730 B.C., where he says how the Messiah will be recognized when He comes. He describes what happens to Jesus during His Passion, as well as Jesus' reaction, "I have set my face like flint...not to be put to shame."

Paul then tells his readers what Jesus went through, taking the form of a slave, not objecting when He was beaten, humiliated, sentenced to death, subjected to the taunts of the crowds and the Pharisees, and died on the cross. Paul says that, because of this, Jesus' name is above every other name.

The narrative of the Passion of the Lord starts out, not with His Passion, but with the establishment of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. From then on, we hear about His love for us, His compassion, His forgiveness of the sins He knew were about to be committed, by Judas, by His disciples, as well as all the people who days earlier were praising Him as the Messiah.

It is sometimes easy to focus today on how long we have to stand for the Gospel, to know, in our mind, what is happening and what will happen, how long this Mass is. Try hard today to listen to Isaiah's words, to see in them the prophesy about Jesus and His saving acts for YOU and ME. Listen to Paul telling his readers and us how Jesus thought, not of Himself and what He had to go through, but of YOU and ME and the graces and mercy we would need in our lives. Open your heart, not your mind, to the Gospel today, feel the feelings of Jesus throughout the Gospel, and realize He did this for you and me. Thank Him and accept His love for you and me today.

The service shows the darkness that comes over the earth upon Christ's death and serves as a powerful reflection for the faithful ahead of the Easter Triduum. Historically it was a portion of the Liturgy of the Hours prayers for Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of Holy Week.

DID YOU KNOW? ... THE EASTER TRIDUUM

The single celebration of the *EASTER TRIDUUM* marks the end of the Lenten season and is actually one Mass celebrated over three days. It begins with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper at sundown on Holy Thursday, reaches its high point in the Easter Vigil, and closes with Evening Prayer on Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery. You will notice that there is no Final Blessing on either Holy Thursday or Good Friday. That is because the sacrifice is incomplete, continuing through the end of the Mass of the Resurrection on Holy Saturday evening.
