



### Deacon Bob's Reflection...

### **EASTER SUNDAY**

From now through the Easter season, until the Seventh Sunday of Easter, our first reading will be from the Acts of the Apostles, the record of what happened after Jesus' Resurrection and the coming of the Holy Spirit. The readings all point to the call of God to go out and tell others about Jesus and His love and power.

Peter's speech in the first reading is not his speech after the Holy Spirit came down upon the Apostles at Pentecost. Rather, this is his speech to the household of Cornelius, all all Gentiles. As the angel says to Peter, "What God has made clean, you are not to call profane." God has made all people good, and the Gentiles are not to be excluded from salvation because of a Jewish proscription.

Paul is saying the same thing to the Colossians. Look to what God is telling you, not what the world is telling you. Don't let religious rules or man's interpretation of God's law limit who you will share God's message with. Listen to the apostolic teaching about God's endless love for every person.

In the Gospel, Mary of Magdala comes to the tomb and finds it empty. She immediately goes and tells the Apostles. None of them yet understand what Jesus told them about His dying and rising from the dead. They still don't know what is about to happen, or what they are supposed to do with this information.

Each of us, with 20/20 hindsight, know what's about to happen and what will happen to the Apostles. What about what will happen with us with what we know now? Jesus has told us, through our Baptism and Confirmation, to go and make disciples of all nations. How do we do that, in our parish, in our little city, in our part of the world we inhabit? We probably don't know much more about our mission from God than the Apostles did at this point. But Jesus gave them the help they needed to accomplish His plan in their lives, and He will also give us the help we need. This Easter season, try to make your heart more open to God's word, and let

it touch you to find how you and I can more clearly share God's message to everyone we meet.

St. Patrick's Cathedral on Sunday, June 1 at 2:30 PM.


