

Deacon Bob's Reflection...

FOURTH SUNDAY of EASTER

We have some major changes in the readings starting this week, Good Shepherd Sunday. The reading from Acts is not Peter and the Church in Jerusalem, but is now about Paul and the missionary journey to the Gentiles. The reading from John's Gospel goes back to Chapter 10, when Jesus was still alive and preaching.

The reading from Acts tells of Paul and Barnabas's first missionary journey in Antioch. Paul had spoken the previous Sabbath about Jesus, and had also stated that Jesus was the Messiah they had been waiting for. Many of them wanted to hear more about Jesus. That is what we hear about today. Many of them were Gentiles or converts to Judaism. Paul and Barnabas did not abandon them when they left, but appointed ministers and teachers to keep instructing them and caring for them.

The reading from Revelation reinforces what Paul says in Antioch, that the ones who "survived the time of great distress", their life on earth, their suffering for the name of Jesus, will come from every nation, race, people and tongue, not just the Jews, still God's Chosen People. Those who will be saved are those who believed in Jesus and were willing to suffer for their belief.

The Gospel, of course, is from the parable of the Good Shepherd. Jesus says He will not lose anyone who comes to Him sincerely. The Pharisees recognize that Jesus is talking about them, and their abandonment of their people. Jesus says He will take care of those whom His Father gave Him.

Jesus has called us to be with Him. Once we accept His call, receive the sacraments, we are His. He will not leave us, forget us, or stop loving us. We may walk away from Him, but He will never leave us. Jesus will always come to seek us out, to let us return to His love and mercy. We have the shepherds of our parish, the priests anointed by God to care for us. We have the sacrament of Reconciliation, the opportunity to tell God we're sorry. We have the Mass and Eucharist, to refresh and strengthen our soul and renew our union with God. Let us use the opportunities we have to become and stay part of the flock of Christ.
