

Deacon Bob's Reflection...

SIXTH SUNDAY of EASTER

As I was looking at the readings for this Sunday, it struck me again that we are sort of reading Part 2, Part 3, and then Part 1. Until we get to Pentecost, our first reading is always about the post-Pentecost Church, while the Gospel is about the pre-Crucifixion situation of the Church.

The purpose of the reading choices is to remind us what Jesus gave His Apostles in the upper room at the Last Supper. He spent the whole time instructing them, preparing them for what He knew was about to happen. He tried to give them words they could recall later on, after His death and before the arrival of the Holy Spirit.

He gave them tools to help them to cope with His death and Resurrection. He gave them His peace: "Peace I leave with you." He gave them His word: "Whoever loves me will keep my word, ...and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him." He promises the Apostles that He will never leave them. And He gives them the Holy Spirit: "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, ...will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you."

Then we see in the first reading how God has kept His word to the Apostles. He has appeared to them, reminded them again of what He had told them at the Last Supper, tried to jog their memory to remember His instructions, and sent the Holy Spirit on them. As Jesus promised, the Holy Spirit gave them wisdom, reminded the Apostles of all Jesus had said at the Last Supper and before, and led them to understand what that meant in their lives now as new men in Christ.

This is not just a history lesson for us. Everything that happened to the Apostles, the instruction, sharing Jesus' Body and Blood, receiving the Holy Spirit, being sent forth to preach the Gospel, meeting resistance from other people, disagreements about how to act, how to show God's love, understanding God's law, has also happened to us, is happening now. But Jesus promises us also, just like the Apostles, to give us the tools we need to be new men and women in Christ, and be His presence in our world today.
