Deacon Bob's Reflection...

SEVENTH SUNDAY of EASTER

This is the last Sunday of Easter. Next week is Pentecost, the end of the Easter season. All of the readings are leading up to a climax in their respective settings.

In the first reading, we are going back to the time when Peter and the other Apostles had been jailed and flogged for their preaching, and rejoiced that they had been found worthy to suffer for Jesus. Stephen was the first man selected to be a deacon, and now he becomes the first person to be a martyr for Jesus.

The reading from Revelation is the end of the Epilogue to the book. In it, John brings back the topics he first brought up in the Prologue and the beginning of Chapter 1, the Alpha and the Omega, the tree of life, the life-giving water, I am coming soon. He tells his readers what he saw, and now reminds them again of what the message of the whole book is.

The reading from John's Gospel is the end of the teaching that Jesus was doing at the Last Supper. It is His final prayer with and for His Apostles. Much like He said several weeks ago, "Love one another as I have loved you", He now prays that His Apostles, disciples and followers will be one in His Church as He and the Father are one, and that all His followers will be of one mind and heart in them.

We hear hopeful things in the Gospel and the reading from Revelation. But we are also reminded of the situation in the real world, the unbelief, the rejection of God. Just as Stephen did not focus on the bad things that were being done, speaking only of God and keeping his eyes on heaven and on God, the readings encourage us to focus, not on the difficulties we may encounter, but on our ultimate destination of heaven. We each need to keep in mind that this world is fallen, in sin, but that Jesus came that we could overcome the difficulties with His help and grace. Try today to focus on God's presence in your life, to carry the memory of this Mass with you throughout the day, and ask God frequently for His help, wisdom and strength.

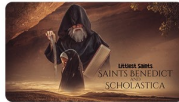
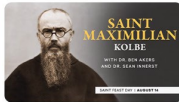
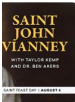
What is Summer with the Saints?
