THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY



The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity was introduced in the ninth century and inserted in the general calendar of the Church in the fourteenth century,

by Pope John XXII. The Solemnity affirms that there is one God and in this one, eternal, incomprehensible God are three Divine Persons; the Father is God; the Son is God, begotten from the nature of the Father from eternity; and the Holy Spirit is God.

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost and should make us mindful that actually every Sunday is devoted to the honor of the Most Holy Trinity.

Deacon Bob's Reflection...



Easter season is over, and we are back in Ordinary Time. But the Church lets us down slowly with several Sundays that are also special celebrations. We start with Most Holy Trinity Sunday.

In the first reading from Proverbs, the Church reminds us that, while the Jews did not believe in the triune God, they did acknowledge a separate spirit, which they called Wisdom, which was with God from the beginning. We call it the Holy Spirit.

Paul, in the second reading, assures the believers that they have been justified, that is, forgiven. But they will not experience heaven on earth. There will still be struggles, to develop their faith and strengthen their hope for the eternal reward promised by Jesus.

In the Gospel from John, Jesus is giving His disciples their final teaching. He knows they will feel they have been left alone. He reassures them that He will send the Holy Spirit to them, and He will reveal to them all the truths they have been hearing from Jesus, and will understand them.

We have probably all prayed to God the Father, and we certainly have prayed to Jesus. It's a little harder to pray to the Holy Spirit, the wind, a tongue of fire, a small, still breath, or a dove. This week, try to relax, open ourselves up to the Spirit of God, and let the Holy Spirit come into our spirit, that we may be able to understand more fully the true, deep love God has for each of us, the tremendous forgiveness He is waiting to give us if we just ask for it sincerely, and the acceptance and joy He will share with us when we humbly return to Him.


