



The Solemnity of Corpus Christi originated in France in the mid-thirteenth century and was extended to the whole Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. The feast is celebrated on the Thursday following Trinity Sunday or, as in the USA, on the Sunday following Trinity Sunday.

The feast calls us to focus on the manifestations of the Body of Christ; the Holy Eucharist and the Church: The primary purpose of this feast is to focus our attention on the Eucharist. The secondary focus is upon the Body of Christ as it is present in the Church.

## Deacon Bob's Reflection...



This is Corpus Christi Sunday, the celebration of Jesus Christ's overwhelming gift to us of His Body and Blood. It is also a reminder to us to properly appreciate this gift.

In the reading from Genesis, Melchizedek, a Canaanite priest, offered bread and wine to God Most High, Abraham's God. This is the first time we hear of a priest offering bread and wine in sacrifice to God.

In Paul's Letter to the Corinthians, he gives the earliest written account of the institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Paul obviously wasn't there, but he also obviously learned what happened from the other Apostles, and the words Jesus used.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus gives a preview of what will happen at the Last Supper. The breaking of bread is something that would happen at every Jewish meal, but Jesus gives additional significance to this by the multiplying of the loaves.

While Paul's is the only account that talks directly about the Body and Blood of Christ, the Church wants each of us to realize how important each of these events is in the gift from God. When you or I receive Communion, the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Christ, it is a total and complete sharing in Jesus' life. We are closer to Jesus than any of His Apostles were. Jesus is alive in our body at that time; we are the persona of Jesus. It should be a complete surrender of our life to Jesus. Each of us needs to ask ourselves if we are really worthy to be united completely to Jesus each time we receive Communion. Jesus gives Himself completely to you and me. Can I give myself completely to Him?


## NATIVITY OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST
