


#### PARISH UPDATES...

#### What's happening structurally at St. Joseph?

As you've noticed, we have several improvement projects going on at St. Joseph Parish.

Visible from the outside is the scaffolding as we repair the bell tower. The work is being done in conjunction with the Archdiocese and with approval from the City of Kingston, so we are not on our own timeline.

Inside, the Sanctuary is being updated. The wallpaper, which was peeling and in disrepair, has been removed. The walls will be painted and the sanctuary pieces will be touched up and repaired as needed. We



## Deacon Bob's Reflection...

17<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time

Today we hear about prayer in the first reading and the Gospel. And Paul instructs the Colossians in the power of prayer and God's mercy.

In the first reading from Genesis, Abraham is walking with his visitors from last week. They are walking toward Sodom and Gomorrah, where his brother Lot and his family live. Abraham is praying, speaking with God, asking God for mercy for the innocent people living in those cities.

Paul, in the Letter to the Colossians, is warning them not to fall prey to false teachers. He is reminding them that they accepted the true Gospel from him, were baptized, had all their sins forgiven, and received the promise of eternal life through faith in God and Jesus. God's mercy has come to them by faith and by the prayers of the whole Church for their salvation.

Today's Gospel is Luke's shorter version of the "Our Father". Each rabbi, or teacher, had his own prayer that he taught his followers, and Jesus' disciples ask Him to give them a special prayer for their group. Jesus tells them to call God "Father", someone they can talk to, relate to, feel comfortable with. He teaches them to trust God and surrender to Him. And He urges them to be persistent in prayer.

We may sometimes feel like we can't ask God for something because we've been asking for it for a long time. If it is something that God knows will not help us to grow closer Him, God may not give it to us, but might make us realize it will not be good for us. I pray every day for God to let me win the lottery, but I don't. If I win, I may think more about money than God. It may draw me away from God. Jesus says, "Ask and you will receive." He doesn't say you will receive exactly what you ask for, but you will get what God knows you need to achieve eternal life with Him in heaven.

#### **CHALLENGE FOR THE WEEK:**

Remain consistent in daily prayer as you ask God to respond to your pleas.
