

## Deacon Bob's Reflection...

19<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Ordinary Time

Unlike last week's readings, which were very clear on the topic they presented, this week's readings are less clear. But they all talk about trust in God.

In the first reading from Wisdom, the writer says that the Israelites, who had been disappointed in Moses' dealings with pharaoh, trusted him, as God's voice, about the salvation He would bring to them. God had killed the first-born of man and beast of Egypt, and they believed that God would now release them from pharaoh's grasp.

In the Letter to the Hebrews, the writer recounts all that God had done for His chosen people. He also reminds them of Abraham's great faith, leaving his home for who -knew-where, believing God when He said he would have a son, and sacrificing his son, through whom God had promised descendants.

Jesus, in the Gospel, issues a strong challenge. Sell everything you have and give alms. His purpose is to encourage His followers to trust completely in God, if your treasure is holding you back from relying on God and His promises for your life. Much like last week's Gospel, don't assume you have lots of life left and need things for the future. We don't know when the end of our age will come.

The middle part of Luke's Gospel is often used at wake services. "... {B]e prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come." Jesus is warning us not to assume we will be able to control our life to the point of waiting to the last minute to make everything right. I've spoken before about my father, who died in an accident with no preparation. Jesus wants us to be ready at every moment for Him to call us to our judgment, to trust Him to provide for our spiritual life as well as our material life. This week, try to say every day the words of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to Saint Faustina, "Jesus, I trust in You."


