We are looking for adults, college students, high school and middle school youth to assist us with 200 younger children in growing in their Catholic faith.




The Church celebrates the nativity or birth of only three persons. The birth of Our Lord, Dec. 25 is, of course, universally known. The Nativity of Mary, Sept. 8, is probably the least known. The third nativity is that of John the Baptist. The Birth of Jesus is fixed by

tradition on December 25. Thus, his conception (the Annunciation) is celebrated on March 25. Using a hint from Luke's Gospel (Luke 1, 28) that the Annunciation took place "in the sixth month" of the pregnancy of John's mother, Elizabeth, his birth is celebrated on June 24. The Nativity of John the Baptist enjoys the rank of "solemnity" and has a vigil Mass. Also for the northern hemisphere, the summer solstice (June 21-22) has just passed. The hours of daylight have begun to decrease. The Nativity of John is like an early announcement of Advent when we prepare to welcome the true light of the world. The daylight that now begins to diminish is an acknowledgment of what John said about his relationship the Jesus: He must increase; I must decrease. (John 3, 30).

Come celebrate the Vigil of John on June 23 with Mass at 7:00 p.m. and bonfire and refreshments .
