

A Word from Father...



Dear Friends,

As you may have noticed in both last week and this week's Sunday Bulletins, in September our church family will be blessed by a week-long parish renewal mission to celebrate the *Jubilee Year of Mercy* that Pope Francis declared some months ago. Leading the mission will be *Msgr. Denis Carlin*, a priest of the Diocese of Paisley, Scotland, (not far from Glasgow). He is an old friend of mine from our years in Europe; he was rector of the Scottish Seminary in Salamanca, Spain, and I was rector of the American College (seminary) in Leuven, Belgium. Msgr. Carlin is a delightful preacher and wise teacher; I am sure you will fall in love with him almost as soon as he opens his mouth and the soft, dulcet tones of his Scottish accent touches your ears!

As some of you remember from years ago a parish mission was a very special event in the life of a parish; a week was set aside for powerful preaching (the Redemptorists were specialists in this kind of ministry) that, hopefully, moved parishioners to a deeper commitment to their faith and their Church. Mostly long gone are the days of "hellfire and brimstone", replaced by a kind of mission preaching that animates the heart and soul of the parish through a deeper experience of Christ's love and the mercy of the Father.



The mission will begin with the weekend Masses on Sept 17-18, then continue over the course of five nights (Sunday through Thursday) with a prayer service with music, Scripture, reflection/sermon, and a brief social. On Friday night, we hope to have a parish dinner to celebrate. We will also be visiting our homebound parishioners to make sure they are included as well as our kids at Cataldo. Your friends and family members will be most welcome to

join us, too, of course. In fact, I hope that you will liberally invite many to join us, especially people who might be looking for something more in their lives or who might have left our parish family in the past (they are STILL our parish family!).

We'll be working on the details with Msgr. Carlin over the summer, so stay tuned!

The expenses of the parish mission have been subsidized by a generous gift from a parishioner.

I really hope that this great event in the life of our parish will serve us well as we seek to deepen our parish's life and ministry, grow spiritually ourselves, and motivate us to share the mercy of the Father made manifest in Christ with all whom we know.
