




Please record the names of your beloved dead in our memorial book, which will be placed in the sanctuary throughout this month. We will remember them in each and every parish Mass this month.



As you read this column, I am at play in Rome! Well, probably not exactly "at play," but certainly having a great experience in the Eternal City along with Father Miguel from Our Lady of Fatima Parish and thousands and thousands of others who have gathered here for two great celebrations.



The first, of course, is the elevation of Archbishop Cupich of Chicago (and need I say, formerly of Spokane!) by Pope Francis as a new Cardinal of the Church. And not just Archbishop Cupich, but sixteen others including Americans, Archbishop Tobin of Indianapolis and Bishop Kevin Farrell of Dallas. The celebration surrounding this "Consistory" will be one filled with great hope as a new class of bishops commit themselves to "shed their blood" for Christ (the meaning of their new red cassocks), advise the Pope, and serve as electors at the next Conclave, which, hopefully, will not be any time soon.
