The Sacred Heart Pastoral Council continues to work on its major restructuring of our system of parish committees and ministries with the hope of having the new plan ready to go by the end of May, 2017. Here is where we are now at following our most recent meeting last week:



- ❑ The new Pastoral Council Constitution, which will establish the new structure, will be ratified at the meeting of the Council on **February 7th**.
- ❑ A second **Parish Leadership Summit** will be held on Saturday, **February 25, 9:00 am—1:00 pm**, to assist all committees to revise their working documents to reflect the new structure and to choose who will represent those committees on the new Pastoral Council.
- ❑ Our inaugural meeting with both new and old Pastoral Council members on **May 2, 2017** with the hope of orienting ourselves for our upcoming work to begin in earnest in September after all have returned from summer vacations.
